CASTING A VOTE: To vote for the candidate of your choice, darken the oval () to the LEFT of the candidate's name. If you make a mistake, return your ballot to the Election Official and obtain another. Do not attempt to erase any marks made in error.

WRITE-IN: To vote for a write-in candidate, write the name of the candidate on the line provided and darken the oval. A write-in vote will NOT be counted unless the vote is for a DECLARED write-in candidate.

STRAIGHT PARTY VOTING: You may vote a Straight Party Ticket for all the candidates of the party of your choice by darkening the oval for the party in the STRAIGHT PARTY section. Your voting mark will give every candidate of that party a vote. Then move to the NONPARTISAN OFFICES, JUDICIAL RETENTION QUESTIONS and PUBLIC QUESTIONS and vote as desired.

SPLIT-TICKET VOTING: You may vote a Straight Party Ticket by marking ONE of the party choices and then voting for individual candidates of your choice in any other party OR you may vote for individual candidates of your choice in each office.

JUDICIAL RETENTIONS AND PUBLIC QUESTIONS: To vote on Judicial Retentions and Public Questions, darken the oval to the LEFT of the word "YES" or "NO."

		PROPERTY TAX CAP QUESTION
		"SHALL PROPERTY TAXES BE LIMITED FOR ALL CLASSES OF PROPERTY by amending the Constitution of the State of Indiana to do the following: (1) Limit a taxpayer's annual property tax bill to the following percentages of gross assessed value: (A) 1% for an owner-occupied primary residence (homestead); (B) 2% for residential property, other than an owner-occupied primary residence, including apartments; (C) 2% for agricultural land; (D) 3% for other real property; and (E) 3% for personal property. The above percentages exclude any property taxes imposed after being approved by the voters in a referendum. (2) Specify that the General Assembly may grant a property tax exemption in the form of a deduction or credit and exempt a mobile home used as a primary residence to the same extent as real property?"
