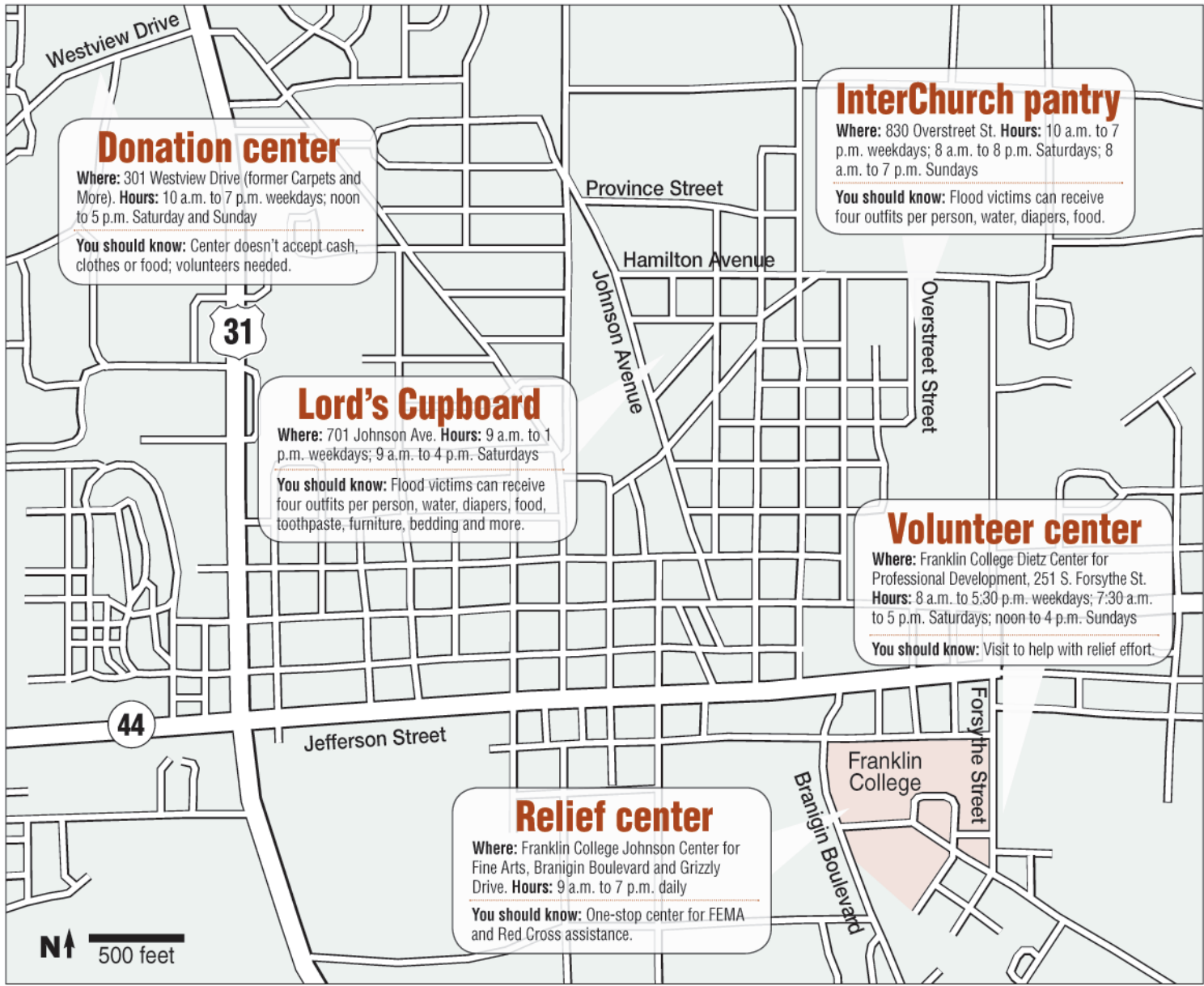


HOW TO HELP AND WHERE TO GET HELP:

Here's a look at places where flood victims can get assistance with disaster relief and where individuals can offer aid to victims.



Donation center

Where: 301 Westview Drive (former Carpets and More). **Hours:** 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. weekdays; noon to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday

You should know: Center doesn't accept cash, clothes or food; volunteers needed.

Lord's Cupboard

Where: 701 Johnson Ave. **Hours:** 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. weekdays; 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturdays

You should know: Flood victims can receive four outfits per person, water, diapers, food, toothpaste, furniture, bedding and more.

InterChurch pantry

Where: 830 Overstreet St. **Hours:** 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. weekdays; 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Saturdays; 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. Sundays

You should know: Flood victims can receive four outfits per person, water, diapers, food.

Volunteer center

Where: Franklin College Dietz Center for Professional Development, 251 S. Forsythe St. **Hours:** 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. weekdays; 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturdays; noon to 4 p.m. Sundays

You should know: Visit to help with relief effort.

Relief center

Where: Franklin College Johnson Center for Fine Arts, Branigin Boulevard and Grizzly Drive. **Hours:** 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily

You should know: One-stop center for FEMA and Red Cross assistance.
