



PIN OR FALL: Franklin freshman David Coulter, top, demonstrates a pin of sophomore teammate D.J. Dickinson. A wrestler earns a pin when he holds an opponent's shoulder blades to the mat for at least two seconds. A pin is worth six points toward the team's score.



NEUTRAL POSITION: Franklin juniors Mark Mathews, left, and Aaron Rodriguez demonstrate the neutral position. Wrestlers in this position face each other at the beginning of a match.



REFEREE'S OR BASE POSITION: Franklin juniors Mark Mathews, top, and Aaron Rodriguez demonstrate the referee's or base position. One wrestler is on his hands in knees while another is above him in the top position.



ESCAPE: Franklin junior Aaron Rodriguez, left, escapes the control of junior teammate Mark Mathews by emerging from a down position to a standing position. An escape is worth one point in an individual match.



REVERSAL: From left, Franklin sophomore D.J. Dickinson, in the bottom position, earns a reversal on freshman teammate David Coulter by going from the down position into a control position in one fluid move. A reversal is worth two points in an individual bout.
