# TALLYING DAMAGES



### Franklin police

**Total damage:** Unknown

**At a glance:** Nearly 2 feet of water filled the police station, which has since been gutted and is awaiting construction. More than two dozen police cars were ruined (pictured). **Related story, Page A2**



### Greenlawn Cemetery

**Total damage:** Unknown

**At a glance:** Storage shed filled with 5 feet of floodwater; office had more than 2 feet. Mowing equipment and historical documents were damaged. Headstones were knocked over. Cemetery is open. **Related story, Page A2**



### Franklin city parks

**Total damage:** At least \$500K

**At a glance:** Six parks covered in debris, most damage centered in Province Park (pictured), which is closed along with Community Park. City is seeking federal aid for repairs. **Related story, Page A2**



### Greenwood city parks

**Total damage:** \$80K

**At a glance:** Nearly 5 feet of water rushed through Old City Park, Northwest Annex Park and Westside Park. Destroyed Old City Park's tennis courts, which are being turned into a parking lot (pictured). City is seeking federal aid. **Related story, Page A2**



### Courthouse annex

**Total damage:** Unknown

**At a glance:** About 3 inches of floodwater/sewage mix seeped into ground floor of three-story building. Damaged areas have been gutted and decontaminated. Health, planning and surveyor offices were displaced.



### Oren Wright Building

**Total damage:** Unknown

**At a glance:** Building had about 6 feet of water inside; no repair work has been done yet. Several offices, including prosecutor's office, Purdue Extension and veterans affairs, were displaced. **Related story, Page A2**
