The wedding is set for Oct. 14 at First Baptist Church in Franklin.



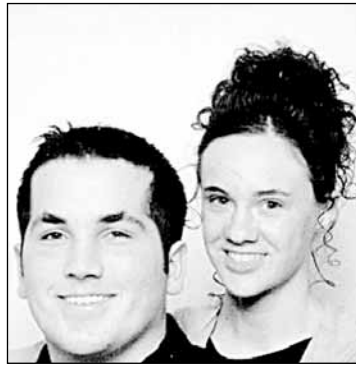
### Stacey Taylor Dustin Spaw
