

Tips, scratches lead police to suspects in burglary

Two teens arrested Thursday for burglarizing a Greenwood home have evidence on them, literally, according to police.

Both men have scratches on their arms and hands. One of the men told police he got the scratches while trying to retrieve items from inside a safe stolen from the home, according to an arrest affidavit.

Police arrested the two men after receiving a tip they were involved in a burglary at the 1600 block of S. Morgantown Road.

Thomas M. Meyer, 18, Indianapolis, told police he and two men entered the residence while two others waited outside on Monday, according to the affidavit.

Meyer told police the group stole jewelry and a safe from inside the home. They broke the safe open with a crow bar and scratched their arms and hands while trying to retrieve the items inside, according to the affidavit.

A second man police arrested, Kyle Zelesnick, 19, Camby, also had scratches on his arms and hands. He was arrested after a short chase on foot but did not admit to being involved with the burglary, according to the affidavit.

Meyer, 6514 Creek Bay Drive, Apt. B, and Zelesnick, 8922 Browns Valley Lane, were arrested on a charge of burglary and are being held in the Johnson County jail on \$20,000 bond.

Drugs found in police van leads to charges for trio

Three people on their way to the county jail reportedly tried to ditch their drugs in the back of a police van, police said.

Police stopped the trio for speeding on State Road 37 around 9 p.m. Thursday.

A police dog was brought to the car and indicated there were drugs inside. Officers searched the car and found burned marijuana and pills of generic Xanax, an anti-anxiety drug, according to the police report.

A check of the car also showed both the car and the license plate had been reported stolen, according to the report.

All three people in the vehicle were taken to the county jail, and when the three arrived, officers found marijuana in the back of the

van, according to the report.

Police: Man says he wanted to scare ex-boss

An ex-employee of the city of Greenwood was arrested Thursday for stalking his former supervisor, police said.

Paul Peoni, director of the city engineering department, called police Thursday and said a former employee was following him,

according to a police report.

The ex-employee, Gary L. Arnold, 43, was fired from his position as an engineering technician Dec. 14 for making threats against Peoni and other employees, Greenwood Police Chief Joe Pitcher said.

Peoni noticed Arnold's vehicle parked across the street from city offices on Emerson Avenue around 6 p.m. Peoni was headed to city offices on Madison Street and noticed the truck was following him after he made three turns onto other streets, according to the report.

Officers stopped Arnold at U.S. 31 and Madison Avenue and told him his former supervisor had complained the man was stalking him.

Arnold told officers he was following Peoni to scare him, according to the police report.

He told police he discussed his termination with an attorney whose office was in the same building as the engineering department. When he left, he saw Peoni exit the building and decided to follow him because his former supervisor had made him angry. He also told the officer he had been told previously by Greenwood police that he was not allowed in the building located at 225 S. Emerson Ave., according to the police report.

Officers also found binoculars in Arnold's vehicle, according to the police report.

Arnold, 1043 Barefoot Trail, Greenwood, was arrested on a charge of stalking. He was released from the Johnson County jail on \$3,000 bond.
