## Mailboxes to be relocated

### Prince's Lakes residents upset about change

Members of a small community are banding together to fight the U.S. Postal Service.

The dispute started in August when 103 Prince's Lakes residents were told to move their mailboxes to the ends of their streets.

Postal officials are concerned carriers will have an accident when turning around on dead-end streets. Some residents argued against the move, which would make them walk or drive farther every day for their mail.

Postal carriers will deliver mail to the new locations on seven streets starting next month, said Kim Yates, customer relations coordinator for the postal service.

Residents wrote letters to U.S. Rep. Mike Pence, R-Ind., signed petitions and met with postal officials to voice their objections to the move.

Some, such as Prince's Lakes Town Council President Charlie Bourne, argue that the postal worker's concerns of safety are unfounded because no accidents have happened in recent years. Others worry for their own safety when they walk or drive to the new location.

Dottie Powell's mailbox will be moved to the top of a hill on Warford Street, and she worries about oncoming traffic, elderly residents who might not be able to walk up the hill and the trek to the mailboxes without a side-walk.

Residents are required to move their mailboxes to posts at the end of their street.

Postal workers will install the posts for the boxes, but residents should call the post office to see where their box should be placed, Yates said.

Owners of the mailboxes will be responsible for maintaining the boxes.

Postal carriers will begin delivering mail to the new locations March 15, she said.

## New court will have to wait

State lawmakers didn't approve a request this year to add a new court in Johnson County.

Other counties ranked higher on a list that looked at which counties had the greatest need for new judges to balance out busy caseloads, Johnson Circuit Judge Mark Loyd said.

Court administrators plan to make a new request in the next legislative session to the state commission on courts, Loyd said.

They think there's still enough time for Johnson County to get a court in place and a new judge elected before a target date of 2008, Loyd said.

The decision to not grant Johnson County another court was not a surprise, given that it took nearly four years before lawmakers agreed to add Superior Court 3, Loyd said.

Since Johnson County is one of the fastest growing counties in the state, Loyd said he and other judges and county leaders expect Johnson County to move up the list quickly.

"We're fairly high (on the list) at this point in time," Loyd said. "We expect to go much higher."
