

'Grizzly' shows man's descent into madness

Director Werner Herzog's acclaimed 2005 documentary film "Grizzly Man" (8 p.m., Discovery) makes its TV debut. Herzog assembled "Grizzly" from the hundreds of hours of videos shot by obsessive naturalist Timothy Treadwell over the course of several summers he spent living among the giant bears in Alaska's Katmai National Park and Preserve.

'Grey's Anatomy' picks up speed Sunday

Win or lose, the Seattle Seahawks' hometown will end Sunday night on a harrowing note: A medical case arrives at "Grey's Anatomy's" Seattle Grace Hospital that endangers everyone in the operating room.

"Something happens and bad stuff follows," said "Grey's" creator Shonda Rimes. "That something involves a 'code black.' " "It's bad," said actress Kate Walsh, who plays Dr. Addison Shepherd, wife of Dr. Derek "McDreamy" Shepherd and the roadblock keeping McDreamy and series narrator Meredith Grey (Ellen Pompeo) apart.

"We should all hold hands and pray that it doesn't happen here," Pompeo added. So much teasing for something that, in previews, looks like one of those very chaotic "ER" episodes that involve a bomb scare or hostage crisis in the hospital. "I don't think it's anything like that other show," Rimes said. "It's our show sort of on speed." I suppose that's what viewers should expect of a post-Super Bowl episode (airing at approximately 10:15 p.m.) that's seeking to hang onto a large and largely male audience for a show that tends to woo women with its soapy stories about young doctors-in-training and their love lives.

roles, but Asian-American actress Sandra Oh just won a Golden Globe Award for her portrayal of driven Dr. Cristina Yang. "I think the casting is really important to the show's success, not just because they're phenomenal actors," Rimes said, "but also if somebody looks at the show and thinks to themselves, 'OK, there's no longer anything unusual about having half your cast be a people of color,' that's important." Told from the point of view of Meredith Grey, "Grey's Anatomy" features a tangled web of romances, including Chang and Dr. Burke (Isaiah Washington) — a relationship Rimes hesitantly

compares to "The Taming of the Shrew" — and Izzie (Katherine Heigl) and Alex (Justin Chambers). Then there's bumbling George (T.R. Knight), who pines for Meredith as she pines for McDreamy. "She is a lead character who is flawed," Rimes said of the show's namesake. "She's not always nice. She doesn't always say the perfect thing. She is somebody, in a very large sense, without a home, without a family, without ties, without (anyone) when you first met her."

Though it hasn't even been a full year since "Grey's Anatomy" made its debut, the show is already a Top 10 hit, ranking as the eighth most-watched prime-time series this season. "Grey's" has connected not because it's one of the greatest TV dramas of all time, but because it's entertaining and also because it relates well to a large swath of the population. That's due at least in part to a cast that resembles the spectrum of real-life hospital employees in a way "ER" did not in its early seasons. Not only are there three African-Americans in prominent
