Two stores are being built in a shopping center across from Greenwood Park Mall.

A Guitar Center store, under construction in Greenwood Pavilion, is expected to open in the spring or summer, said Ed Ferguson, director of the Greenwood Planning Department.

Another smaller store could be added next to the new store, but no companies have applied to move into the space yet, he said.

The 15,000-square-foot music supply store will be between David's Bridal and JoAnn Fabrics in the strip mall owned by Ohio-based Truss Realty Corp.

Guitar Center is a music supply store that sells instruments, such as guitars and drums, and recording supplies, according to the company's Web site.

The store will face competition from five other music stores in the area.

Similar stores are nearby. Guitars and More is located on County Line Road north of Greenwood Park Mall. Guitar Works is located about four miles from the strip mall on State Road 135 in Greenwood. Guitar Center lists one other

Indianapolis area store located in Castleton on its Web site.

The total size of the store will be about half the 35,000-square-foot fabric store next door.

About 3,500 square feet will be left for a store between Guitar Center and the bridal store, according to plans on file with the planning department.

The space for the new stores was vacant before construction started on the guitar store, Ferguson said.

Man convicted for 2004 beating of fiancée

A Greenwood man was convicted Thursday of beating and choking his fiancée in their apartment. The woman said she was attacked because he was afraid she was going to leave him.

A jury found John Friend III, 24, guilty of criminal confinement, intimidation and domestic

battery in a trial conducted in Johnson County Circuit Court.

Friend was also found guilty of being a habitual offender. He had three prior felony convictions for theft or receiving stolen property and fraud, according to the Johnson County Prosecutor's Office. The jury returned that verdict Friday.

Friend could get a 50-year prison sentence for the combined charges. His sentencing is sched-

uled for March 13.

In the December 2004 incident, Friend hit and physically assaulted his fiancée after she told him about a trip she was going to take with her mother, according to a statement from the prosecutor's office.

With her 4-year-old son nearby, Friend ordered the woman into the bedroom and repeatedly choked her until she lost consciousness, the prosecutor's statement said.

When Friend left the apartment to buy cigarettes, the woman ran from the house with her son and flagged down a Greenwood police officer, who was patrolling the neighborhood, the statement said.

Friend said he and his fiancée had been slapping and shoving each other during an argument after having too much to drink and that he left the house to avoid more of a fight, defense attorney Phil Wilson told the jury.
