

Non-toxic printing method on display

Leading intaglio artists from around the world will be featured in Contemporary Printmaking 2006, an international invitational exhibition running through Feb. 10 at the University of Indianapolis' Christel DeHaan Fine Arts Center Gallery, 1400 E. Hanna Ave.

With nearly 30 works by 10 artists, the exhibition highlights the use of non-toxic techniques that eliminate the need for dangerous nitric acid to etch metal printing

The artists include Friedhard Kiekeben of the University of Chester in England and Australian-born Keith Howard of the Rochester Institute of Technology in New York, who have revitalized the art of printmaking with their use and teaching of non-toxic techniques.

The German-born Kiekeben's 80-piece installation "Flow," created specially for display in Indianapolis, will occupy an entire wall of the gallery. He will install the work Monday and present a guest lecture at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday in Room 115 of the DeHaan center, following the 6 p.m. artist reception in the gallery. Howard, a native of Australia, is exhibiting four large prints.

The exhibition was organized by Donna Lee Adams, assistant professor of art and design at the University of Indianapolis, who has studied with Howard and Kiekeben. She founded the university's own non-toxic printmaking studio in 2001, at which time it was one of just a handful in the United States.

Adams and local artists Ginny Taylor Rosner and Cynthia Blasingham are featured along with nationally and internationally known printmakers Bernice Cross, Elizabeth Dove, Erin Holscher, Indrani Nayar-Gall and David Jay Reed.

Movie producer to participate in Q&A

Generation X filmmaker, producer and author Kevin Smith will make a rare appearance at 8 p.m. Feb. 2 at the Hilbert Circle Theatre for a unique lecture and open forum question and answer format titled "Silent Bob Speaks." Content is not suitable for children.

Smith started as an independent film producer in 1994 when his first production, "Clerks," earned critical acclaim and awards at the Sundance and Cannes film festivals and became a major commercial success.

During the past decade, films such as "MallRats," "Chasing Amy," the controversial and satirical "Dogma" and "Jay and Silent Bob Strike Back" have continued Smith's legacy as a creative filmmaker and producer who has become a pop icon and voice for his generation.

In addition to this five-film "Jersey Trilogy" of cultclassics, he explored romantic territory with "Jersey Girl" starring Ben Affleck, George Carlin, Jennifer Lopez and Liv Tyler. He was executive producer of "Good Will Hunting." His next film project will be "Clerks 2: Passion of the Clerks."
