Organization recruiting wide range of people interested in helping community

An organization that provides leadership training and fosters creative community development, problem-solving and involvement is accepting applications for its next class.

Leadership Johnson County is recruiting students for the Class of 2007. A goal of the group is to develop informed and involved individuals who work together to make the community better.

Participants develop their individual leadership style, learn about the social and political issues facing the county, practice community problem solving, and prepare for leadership and trusteeship roles in the community.

A key element of the class is mastering the art of collaboration.

The program began in 1995. Classes each year include 23 to 30 members.

Classes are made up of representatives from diverse areas of Johnson County, including business, agriculture, government and social services.

Past participants, including farmers, teachers, bankers, healthcare professionals and social workers, have used the class to share ideas and learn about the county.

The monthly meetings, besides offering seminars on leadership and personal and professional development, include discussions on issues important to Johnson County.

For instance, past classes have toured the county's sewage treatment facilities, met educators and elected officials, and learned
