

# New York boys trade subway for sunscreen

**B**rash young working-class guys from a New York outer borough (don't dare call them an "Entourage") decamp for the sunny beaches and glitzy nightclubs of Miami in the new prime time soap opera "South Beach" (8 p.m., UPN, TV-PG).

But not everything in Miami involves sunscreen and disco balls. The guys, Matt (Marcus Coloma) and Vincent (Chris Johnson), get involved in some of the heavier aspects of security work at a hotel named the Soleil, owned by the beautiful Elizabeth Bauer (Vanessa Williams, in Joan Collins mode).

Giancarlo Esposito stars as a shady entrepreneur. In between bouts of business, both legitimate and not so nice, "South Beach" will provide plenty of glances at the resort city's music and modeling scenes. Note: A review copy was not made available in time for this column.

Immature viewers of all ages can rejoice as "Mythbusters" (9 p.m., Discovery) enters a brand new season. For the uninitiated, this show tests urban legends and common assumptions with good old-fashioned laboratory know-how.

Do corked baseball bats provide hitters with an advantage? Do alligators breed in city sewers? Are commercial passenger planes hotbeds of contagion?

Between them, hosts Jamie Hyneman and Adam Savage have more than three decades of experience in building models and other special effects for Hollywood movies. They can build just about anything, but they really seem to enjoy blowing stuff up. That's where the permanent immaturity comes in.

They not only take painstaking care in scientific deconstruction and just plain old destruction, but they can't help laughing to themselves as they go along. They make a strong if slightly demented argument that geeks really do have more fun.

In tonight's episode they test the legend that a prisoner devised a crossbow out of newspapers, a cafeteria tray and the elastic in his underwear and used it to kill a fellow inmate. Jamie and Adam compete to devise their own crossbow in their laboratory and have way too much fun shooting it at their disrespected test dummy.

Along the way, their helpers put other urban legends to the test. Does vodka really work as a mouthwash? Will it take the smoky smell out of your clothes? Will it fend off a bee attack? You'll just have to tune in for further "proof."

The three-part series "Walking the Bible" (8 p.m., WFTV, WTUV) continues. Host, storyteller and bestselling author Bruce Feiler hoofs it through 10 countries on three continents.

Along with biblical archaeolo-

gist Avner Green, he explores the geography of the Old and New Testaments, from Turkey's Mount Ararat to the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers in Iraq. "Walking" concludes Jan. 18.

On two episodes of "Lost" (ABC, TV-PG, D, L), the crash and its aftermath from both sides now (8 p.m.), Charlie's secret (9 p.m.).

Michael J. Fox says that acting for him, these days, is "like being a right-handed painter and being forced to paint with your left hand."

"You go, 'Yeah, I'm artistic, but the lines aren't straight anymore. I have creativity, but I'm not staying within the lines.'"

Since quitting acting full-time in 2000 because of the debilitating symptoms of Parkinson's disease, first diagnosed in 1991 but not revealed to the public until 1998, the "Family Ties" and "Spin City" star has only occasionally acted on TV.

In 2001 he returned for several guest appearances as Deputy Mayor Michael Flaherty in ABC's "Spin City," and in 2004 guest starred as a surgeon with obsessive-compulsive disorder on two episodes of NBC's "Scrubs."

Now the 44-year-old Fox guest stars in at least three episodes of ABC's "Boston Legal." He plays a business tycoon, Daniel Post, a cancer sufferer who hires the notorious legal firm Crane, Poole and Schmidt to defend him.

Post's been sued for corrupting a study for a new cancer-fighting drug by using his insider clout to ensure he was given the non-

placebo. Amid the court case he becomes romantically entangled with his attorney, Denise Bauer (Julie Bowen.)

Fox's first episode, "The Cancer Man Can," airs Tuesday. His story arc concludes Feb. 7. All the episodes air at 10 p.m.

The producers of "Boston Legal" knew since last season of Fox's interest in the show, but it wasn't until now that a suitable role came up.

Executive producer Bill D'Elia says the actor was "number one on a list of one," because the character was someone that had to have irresistible charm.

"It was kismet, a combination of several events occurring to create perfect karma," says D'Elia, delighted that Fox signed on for the David E. Kelley series.

Fox says he is a fan of "Boston Legal" for a number of reasons, including its smart and funny take on ethical and moral issues.

He also likes the way the show understands the complexities of human nature and that it is not afraid to recognize that "sometimes people are likable and they are corrupted, and sometimes they are incorruptible but kind of off-putting."

Fox, once the cute young Marty McFly in the "Back to the Future" trilogy of feature films, says, "What I loved was being part of the creative process again."

"Something as simple as being in a night shoot and smelling the smell of carbon lights in the cold air. 'Wow, the smell of the grease paint!' It was nice, and nice being involved with other actors."
