Knicks acquire Rose from Raptors for Davis

TORONTO

The Toronto Raptors finally traded Jalen Rose on Friday, sending him to the New York Knicks for forward Antonio Davis.

The Knicks also received a first-round draft pick and an undisclosed amount of cash from the Raptors in a deal involving dismal teams who played each other Friday night in Toronto. The Raptors won 104-90.

Rose and Davis did not play in the game; Knicks coach Larry Brown said he thought it would be unfair to throw Rose into action immediately. He sat on New York's bench wearing a suit.

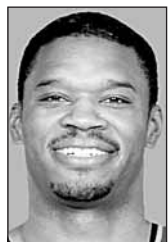
"He's exactly what we need," Brown said. "I think it's a no-brainer. I haven't seen a drop-off in his game. We don't have enough ball-handlers, guys that have experience back there."

Brown, who coached Rose for one season with the Indiana Pacers, said Rose will start at small forward for the Knicks.

Rose's name has been mentioned in trade rumors all season, but he had been difficult to deal because he is making \$15.7 million this season and he has an option at \$16.9 million next season.

Still, the Knicks have long been interested in him, even though they already have the NBA's highest payroll. And they couldn't wait much longer to make a move after losing three straight and nine of 10 to fall behind Toronto into last place in the Atlantic Division.

"I can't wait to play in front of the many Knicks fans, friends and family in the NYC area and very much look forward to being a part of the Knicks organization," Rose said.

Hawks 96 Magic 94

ATLANTA — Joe Johnson sank a jumper over DeShawn Stevenson with less than a second remaining to lift the Atlanta Hawks over the Orlando Magic.

Johnson had 23 points and 11 assists as Atlanta won its third straight game for the first time since 2004. Johnson, guarded by Stevenson, dribbled inside the 3-point line and launched the jumper over the Magic star with 0.7 left on the clock.

Since the Hawks last won three straight games, April 9-12, 2004, general manager Billy Knight has completely overhauled the roster. No players on the current roster were with the team for the end of the 2003-04 season.

The Hawks hit bottom with only 13 wins last season, never winning back-to-back games. Orlando has been going through a similar rebuilding process after a 21-win season in 2003-04. It improved to 36 wins last season but lost its fourth straight Friday night.

Raptors 104 Knicks 90

TORONTO — Chris Bosh scored 29 points, and the Toronto Raptors beat the struggling New York Knicks hours after the teams completed a trade.

Before the game, Toronto sent Jalen Rose to New York for Antonio Davis, a first-round draft pick and cash. Rose and Davis did not play. Rose sat on New York's bench wearing a suit; Davis stayed at the hotel.

The Knicks could have used Rose and Stephon Marbury, who missed the game with a sore shoulder. Eddy Curry scored 17 points for the Knicks, who have lost four straight and 10 of 11.

Clippers 98 Celtics 81

BOSTON — Elton Brand and Sam Cassell keyed a late run that broke open a close game, leading the Los Angeles Clippers to victory against the Boston Celtics.

Brand had six of his 30 points and Cassell had three 3-pointers in a 19-3 run in the fourth quarter that carried the Clippers to their seventh win in eight games. The Celtics lost their fourth consecutive game.

Brand scored at least 30 points for the fourth time in five games and added 11 rebounds and four blocks. Cassell finished with 23 points.

Los Angeles improved to 11-10 on the road, surpassing its total of 10 road wins in each of the past two seasons. It also went 10 games over .500 (27-17) for the first time since 1991-92.

Pistons 87 76ers 80

PHILADELPHIA — Richard Hamilton scored 30 points, Rasheed Wallace added 20, and the Detroit Pistons held on to beat the feisty, short-handed Philadelphia 76ers.

The 76ers played without Allen Iverson, who missed his fourth straight game with injured ankles. Iverson, who has a sprained left ankle and a bone bruise on his right ankle, was going to travel and try to play tonight at Cleveland, Philadelphia coach Maurice Cheeks said.

Bobcats 112 Lakers 102

CHARLOTTE, N.C. — Jumaine Jones scored a career-high 31 points to help the Charlotte Bobcats snap their franchise record 13-game losing streak with a shocker over the Los Angeles Lakers.

Jones, traded from the Lakers to Charlotte in late October, played the entire game as if he was trying to show Los Angeles what it let get away. He made all six of his shots in the first quarter to help the Bobcats open a 40-25 lead they never relinquished.

Jones shot 13 of 20, made five 3-pointers, and had nine rebounds to pace Charlotte.
