winding down to make the score 88-80 and put the game out of reach.

"I wasn't even in attack mode," Arenas said. "I was just trying to come off the pick-and-roll. If there was a mismatch, I was just trying to get to the rim or into the 15-foot area where I could just try to shoot over them."

It was the second-best scoring game by a Pacers opponent this season, surpassed only by Kobe Bryant's 45-point effort for the Los Angeles Lakers on Monday.

"One of the reasons it seemed like a quiet 37 was his shooting percentage," Indiana coach Rick Carlisle said. "Unfortunately, we couldn't get him under control."

Washington coach Eddie Jordan was just as pleased with Washington's defense as he was with Arenas' performance. The Wizards came in allowing 101 points per game.

"It says a lot about the direction we're going in, with the new starting lineup a huge, huge defensive emphasis," Jordan said. "Some guys didn't play as many minutes tonight as normal, but we really cared about doing the things that it takes to win and not about what's going to shoot up in the stat sheet."

Indiana's Anthony Johnson said the Pacers might be taking teams too lightly. Washington came in with a 14-19 record.

"Sometimes I know on certain possessions, it might come down to not really respecting guys on other teams, and I think that we have a problem with that," he said. "They end up burning us somehow, some way."

Butler's 29-foot 3-pointer at the buzzer gave the Wizards a 40-39 halftime lead. Arenas scored 15 points in the first half and Butler added 14.

The Wizards led 60-53 late in the third quarter when O'Neal blocked two consecutive shots by Washington's Brendan Haywood, then scored on the other end. The Pacers outscored the Wizards 8-5 the rest of the period to cut Washington's lead to 65-63 heading into the fourth.

Washington went 13-for-14 from the free-throw line in the fourth quarter and 25 for 34 overall.

"Just didn't seem like we were really right, all night," Carlisle said. "I don't have a reason why that is. We never got anything sustained."
