### MEN

#### No. 4 Villanova 79 Louisville 73

PHILADELPHIA — Allan Ray matched his season high with 26 points, and No. 4 Villanova equaled its best start in the Big East with a win against Louisville.

The Wildcats (16-2, 7-1) twice seemed to have control of the game with a double-digit lead, but the Cardinals (14-7, 2-6) pulled close twice before losing for the fifth time in six games.

As usual, Villanova relied on its four guards for almost all of its offense. Mike Nardi had 20 points, Randy Foye added 19 (all but two in the first half) and Kyle Lowry had eight. They came into the game accounting for 79 percent of the Wildcats' points.

Villanova started 7-1 in the Big East in 1982-83.

Taquan Dean had 23 points and seven assists for Louisville.

#### No. 20 Ohio State 95 Florida A&M 53

COLUMBUS, Ohio — J.J. Sullinger matched his career high with 24 points, scoring 19 in the first half, to lead Ohio State past Florida A&M.
