## Musical offers old-time radio show

Indianapolis Civic Theatre goes on the air with a production of "The 1940s Radio Hour."

The musical will be on stage through Feb. 19. It features the Blue Thunder Big Band and guest appearances by on-air radio talent from WIBC-1070 AM, B105.7 FM and 97.1 HANK FM. The production includes studio characters, flashing applause signs and authentic commercials.

The musical takes place on a snowy night in December 1942, and members of The Mutual Manhattan Variety Cavalcade have gathered for their weekly radio broadcast from the Algonquin Room at the Hotel Astor in New York City. It will feature songs from Glenn Miller, Duke Ellington, Artie Shaw, Cy Oliver and Les Brown.

The musical originally opened on Broadway at the St. James Theatre in 1979.

Indiana women artists are celebrated at the Columbus Museum of Art and Design through April 2.

The exhibit, "Out of the Shadows," features works by Indiana women artists drawn from the permanent collection of the Indianapolis Museum of Art.

The art displays a range of materials, techniques and styles. The exhibit includes oil paintings, watercolors, prints, sculpture, ceramics, metalwork and textiles.

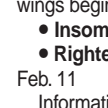
