

### **Outpacing the GDP**

National Health Statistics Group. Then, health care flattened out at 13 percent of gross domestic product.

Overall, the analysts forecast a 7.2 percent annual increase in health-care costs over the coming decade. That's in line with the 7.4 percent increase in 2005.

Still, the overall economy is projected to grow at a rate of only 5.1 percent over the coming decade, which means health care will play an ever-growing role.

"These changes could force payers and providers to re-examine fundamental questions regarding the delivery and financing of health-care services," the analysts said.

Another trend within the new government projections is an evergrowing reliance on the government to foot the bill for health care. By the end of the next decade, the government will pay for about half of the nation's medical costs.

Overall, the most important factor in health-care spending is income, the analysts said. As Americans make more money, they spend more to get healthy. People making \$90,000 are more likely to visit a doctor and get their prescriptions filled than those who make \$50,000, Poisal said.

Investment in research, equipment and people also drives the growth in health-care spending, he said.

"It's consumption and investment," Poisal said. "But primarily it's about consumption."

Medicare spending will more than double, from \$309 billion in 2004 to \$792 billion, in 2015. Medicaid spending will grow from \$293 billion to \$670 billion during the same time span.

The country's aging population is expected to drive increases in two areas of health-care spending: nursing homes and home health.

Spending on nursing homes will grow from \$121.7 billion in 2005 to \$216.8 billion in 2015. Home health will grow from about \$49 billion last year to \$103.7 billion in 2015.

Breakfast and lunch are the busiest times, bringing in about \$400 to \$500 a day, Baker said.

Dinner time is typically slow. Lunch specials run from \$4.95 to \$5.95, and the most expensive item on the menu is a steak for \$7.95.

Atwood makes home-cooked country meals that include meatloaf, lasagna, vegetables, soup, pies and steak. She also worked in the building years ago when it was a bar.

She inspired him to open the restaurant, Baker said, and he chose her as manager since she had experience from Don and Dona's and knew how to cook great food.






