### Pan flies again

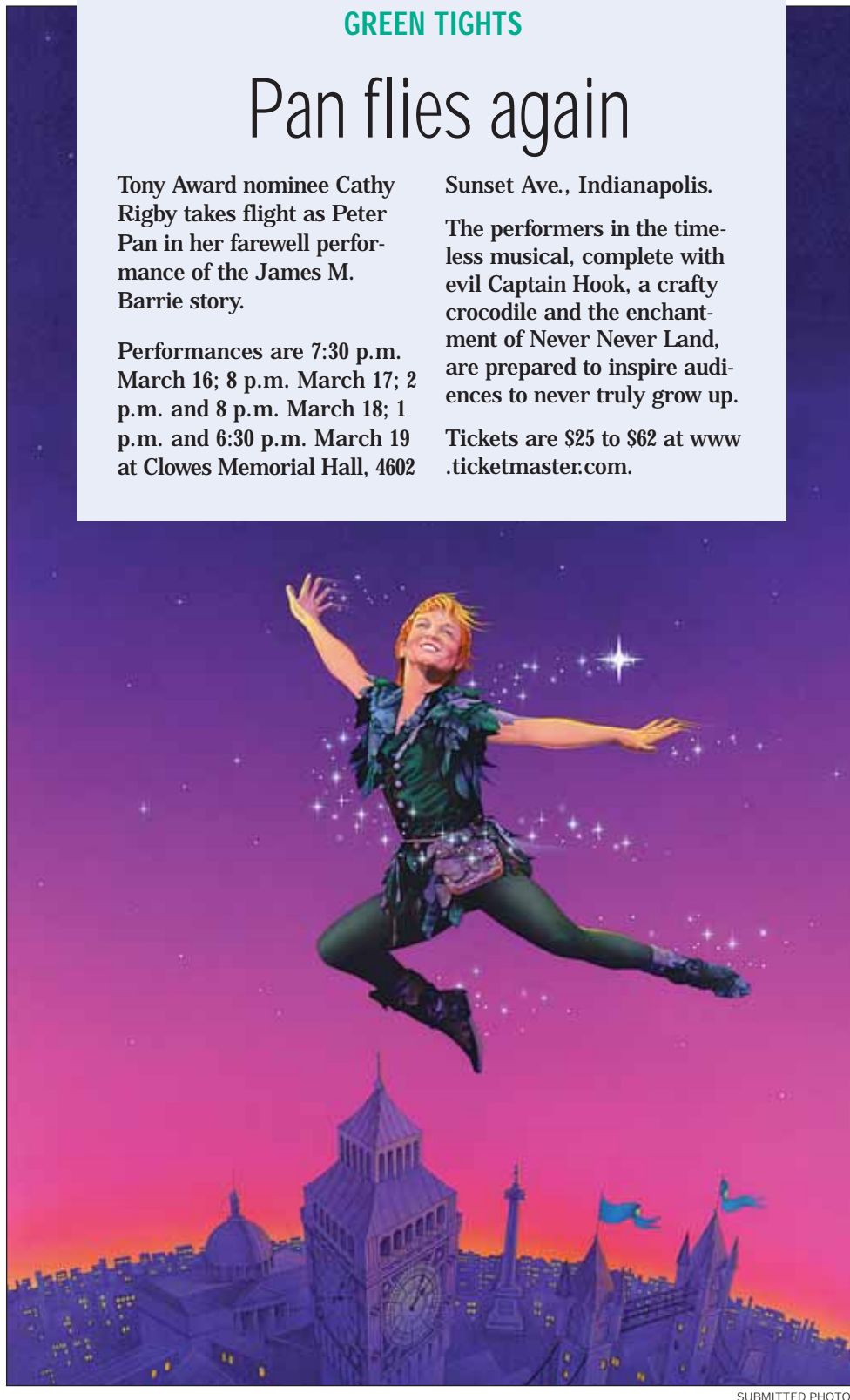
Tony Award nominee Cathy Rigby takes flight as Peter Pan in her farewell performance of the James M. Barrie story.
