

Students will play with orchestra

Professional musicians coach area teenagers

Three Johnson County students will perform with the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday at the Hilbert Circle Theatre in downtown Indianapolis.

Nicole Phiester, a senior from Whiteland Community High School, will play oboe. Her brother, Jason Phiester, a freshman at Whiteland, will play French horn.

The children of Robert and Donna Phiester, a pianist and percussionist, respectively, Nicole and Jason began playing in grade school and both take private lessons.

Nicole and Jason both hope to have careers as performance musicians.

"I'm anxiously awaiting letters from colleges," says Nicole, a senior who has applied to Eastman School of Music, Boston School of Music and Indiana University School of Music.

Nicole is in the show choir, and Jason is in the high school band.

Jacob Denz, the son of Virginia Seubert and David Denz, will play cello.

A senior at Center Grove High School, Denz became interested in classical music in middle school and has taken private piano and cello lessons through Butler and Indiana universities, respectively.

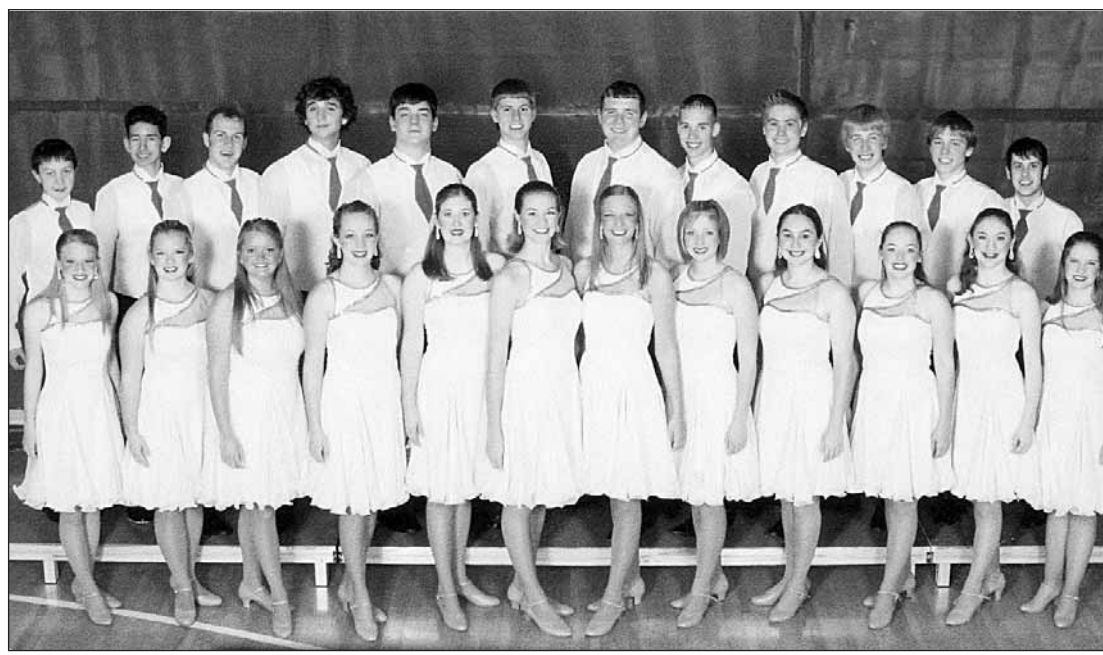
He is a member of the Center Grove Symphonic Orchestra and will be going to Vienna with other students for the celebration of the 250th anniversary of the birth of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart.

"He has a natural love of music," says his mother.

This year's musicians were chosen from 146 applicants from 21 schools in Indiana who auditioned for the opportunity to learn from professional musicians in the orchestra.

The students attend weekly sessions coached by Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra musicians and also ensemble rehearsals.
