On Monday, the board:

• Approved 3-0 appointing Tom Kite to fill the commissioner spot on the drainage board.

A 25-year-old White River Township man who tried to stop his mother from drinking ended up being stabbed in the abdomen with a screwdriver, police said.

Both Anna M. Wells, 43, and her son, Mack, were arrested following the struggle shortly after 2 p.m. Tuesday, according to a report from the Johnson County Sheriff's Office.

The mother was arrested on charges of resisting law enforcement and battery with a deadly

weapon. Her son was arrested on a charge of battery.

Deputies went to the home on Runyon Road after Anna Wells called police about a domestic battery, according to a police report.

She told police that her son had choked her, and she demanded that deputies remove him from the home, the report said.

An investigation found that Anna Wells had locked herself out of her bedroom and tried to open the lock with a screwdriver, the report said. Her son came to help and used a pointed tool to open the door.

Once the door was opened, he

tried to stop her from getting to a beer cooler that was inside the bedroom, the report said.

The two struggled, and at one point he was stabbed in the upper abdomen with the screwdriver, the report said.

Mack Wells admitted that he had choked his mother after she attacked and stuck him with the screwdriver, the report said. He later told police that he had pushed her up against the dresser to restrain her.

At some point during the incident, the family's dog, Smokie, bit Mack Wells' leg, according to the report.

Both mother and son had bleeding scratches on their arms and faces. The mother refused medical treatment and did not cooperate with police during the investigation, the report said.

She refused to obey commands from deputies when they told her to place her hands behind her back, and she struggled when they handcuffed her, the report said.

Anna Wells was booked and held Thursday in the Johnson County jail on \$9,000 for two counts of resisting law enforcement.

Mack Wells was released on \$1,000 bond for battery.

Mom, son arrested after fight

A Franklin teenager crashed a car into a utility pole in White-land reportedly while trying to smoke methamphetamine and drive, police said.

The woman, Chantell Stevens, 19, told police she and two friends reportedly were smoking the drug in the car on the way to a restaurant in White River Township, according to a police report.

She became distracted and drove off the side of the road, striking a utility pole on Tracy Road. No one was injured in the accident, according to a police report.

A homeowner who lived near the accident site told police he saw one of the passengers of the vehicle, whom police identified as Sean Byrd, 23, Greenwood, throw something into his yard before officers arrived, according to the report.

Officers brought a police dog, which found foil and a cigarette pack containing a substance believed to be methamphetamine in the yard. Byrd denied the drugs were his, according to the report.

Police searched the car, which belonged to Robert Lapier, 21, Indianapolis, and found burned marijuana cigarettes and a small amount of loose marijuana in an ashtray in the trunk, which the men said belonged to Byrd, according to the report.

Both men were arrested and taken to the Johnson County jail.

Stevens was not arrested because the officer said he did not have enough evidence to arrest her. The investigation is ongoing, Johnson County Sheriff's Office Maj. Randy Werden said.

Lapier, 8860 St. Peter St., was arrested on a charge of reckless possession of paraphernalia. Byrd, 1881 S. Meridian St., was arrested on a charge of possession of marijuana/hashish and possession of methamphetamine.

Lapier was released on \$2,000 bond, and Byrd was held on \$4,000 bond.

Police search for man who fled arrest in truck

An Indianapolis man drove through his own garage door to flee from officers, police said.

Kyle D. Gilman, 30, fled when an officer tried to handcuff him at his home.

In his getaway, he crashed through his garage door and struck the police car parked in his driveway. Officers used a Taser to try to stop the man, but he still fled, according to a police report.

The man was asleep when a Greenwood probation officer tried to arrest him on a warrant for fail-

ure to appear in court. Gilman's grandmother let the officer into the home. When the man woke up, he resisted the officer when he tried to handcuff him and then ran to his truck in the garage, according to the report.

When Gilman began to get into the truck, the officer used a Taser on him, striking him in the left arm. The man continued to enter the truck and began hitting the officer, who then put the Taser in direct contact with the man's skin, according to the report.

Gilman then drove through the closed garage door, striking the officer's car parked in the driveway and drove through the yard to flee. Marion County sheriff's deputies were informed to look out for the man driving a red pickup, according to the report.

Marion County police are still looking for Gilman, 6628 Tuxedo Lane, who is now wanted on charges of resisting law enforcement, criminal mischief, leaving the scene of an accident, battery on an officer, criminal recklessness and as a habitual traffic offender. He is also still wanted on a warrant for failing to appear in Greenwood City Court.

Woman unharmed after battery threat

An Edinburg man was arrested after a woman said he threatened her with a pair of scissors.

Jeremy D. Streeval, 20, 7573 U.S. 31 South, Edinburg, was arrested on charges of criminal confinement, domestic battery and interfering with the reporting of a crime.

The woman said that Streeval tried to prevent her from leaving his home with their 16-month-old child on Tuesday.

He reportedly put the woman in a headlock to drag her back inside the home and head-butted her, according to a Johnson County Sheriff's Office report.

Streeval reportedly then threatened her with a pair of scissors. When he dropped the scissors, the

woman ran upstairs and locked herself in a bedroom, attempting to call 911, the report said.

The woman said Streeval tried to push other buttons to block her call, but she was able to reach police.

Streeval then fled the house on foot. Officers found him hiding in a garage on North Kyle Street.

The man said the woman had punched and threatened him, so he grabbed a pair of scissors and cut up a pair of her pants, the report said.

Streeval was being held at the Johnson County jail on a \$5,000 bond.

Man pleads guilty in sex abuse case

A former Indianapolis firefighter pleaded guilty to a charge of child molestation this week.

Richard B. Laue, 36, Greenwood, withdrew a not guilty plea to the Class C felony and entered a guilty plea. He could receive two to eight years in prison.

A relative accused Laue of molesting her when she was 11 years old.

The victim, now 15, first told her fifth-grade teacher that Laue touched her inappropriately. The girl did not go into details at the time because she was scared and didn't understand what was happening to her, according to a probable cause affidavit.

In February, the girl told police she understood that the touching was wrong and nothing similar was happening to her friends. She thought at the time that the touching was something everyone had to go through and that she had to listen to Laue because he was an adult, according to the affidavit.

She told police Laue touched her inappropriately and made her touch him inside his pants, the affidavit said.

The Greenwood man resigned from the Indianapolis Fire Department in August 2005. He worked as a firefighter for more than eight years, said Capt. Greg Harris, public information officer for the Indianapolis Fire Department.

Laue, 1547 Blue Brook Way, was arrested in June.

Molestation suspect confesses, police say

A man trying to convince detectives he was innocent of child molestation gave up the fight Wednesday and told police he had touched the girl five years ago.

Howard A. Shaw Jr., 35, told police he touched the girl inappropriately on four occasions when she was 11, according to a report.

The Franklin man came to the police station to take a voice stress test in an attempt to prove his innocence.

But when he sat down to talk with detectives, he told them that he had touched the girl, said Steve Hinkle, a detective with the Franklin Police Department.

Shaw told police he regretted touching the girl but said he felt better since the information was out in the open, Hinkle said.

The victim, now 16, told a counselor Shaw had touched her on several occasions. Detectives questioned Shaw, who initially denied the accusations, Hinkle said.

But he later told police he had touched her inappropriately on four different occasions in 2000, Hinkle said.

Police arrested Shaw, 795 Johnson Ave., on a charge of child molestation. He was released from the Johnson County jail on \$8,000 bond.


