widening the road and adding an access street, and frustrated drivers hope the plan works.

Indianapolis resident Amber Forsyth can spend more than 10 minutes trying to turn onto Fry Road from the Greendale Shopping Centre lot. She has never had an accident, but has experienced many close calls.

Coming from the Kohl's lot and turning left onto Fry Road is worse, Center Grove area resident Theresa Bradford said. She was in an accident about a year ago when a car in the westbound lane of Fry stopped, and the driver waved her forward.

Her car crept into the intersection past the westbound lane, but she failed to notice an eastbound car that hit her vehicle.

Accidents from trying to cross Fry Road from the Kohl's lot are most common, according to Greenwood police.

The crash was her second acci-

dent. She blames her poor judgment on her impatience.

"I was sitting there forever so when this driver waves at me to go, I'm just like 'Oh, thank god,'" she said. "I was just too excited that I forgot to pay attention."

The city plans to widen Fry Road and build a new access street on its east side, near Madison Avenue. The access road and Fry Road will have a stoplight at its intersection, Gabehart said. Workers are still completing the road.

City engineers believe the new access road will lessen traffic congestion at Fry Road near U.S. 31. The new street will give motorists an alternative route leading toward the mall from Fry Road.

The city hopes to hire contractors for the project this year, and finish construction next year at the earliest.

City officials are negotiating to purchase land needed for Fry Road's expansion, and awaiting final approval from the Indiana Department of Transportation because of federal grant dollars the city will spend on the project.

Improvements will cost about \$7.5 million, Gabehart said.
