### Dinner to raise funds, awareness for hunger

The Columbus Area Arts Council and the Empty Bowls Committee present the eighth-annual Empty Bowls Dinner at 5:30 p.m. Jan. 28 at The Commons in Columbus. Homemade soup, bread and desserts will be served until 7:30 p.m., and the Indiana University Soul Revue will perform from 6:30 to 8 p.m. The Empty Bowls project began in 1990 when a Michigan high school art teacher and her students were searching for a way to raise funds to support a food drive. What evolved was a class project to make ceramic bowls for a fund-raising meal. Guests were served a simple meal of soup and bread and invited to keep the bowl as a reminder of hunger in the world. Now, 16 years later, Empty Bowls events have been conducted throughout the world and have raised millions of dollars to support food drives, soup kitchens and other organizations that combat hunger. The cost for the all-you-can-eat soup, bread, beverage and the concert is \$8 for adults and \$3 for children ages 10 and younger. Handmade keepsake bowls will be available for \$18, which also includes all-you-can-eat soup, bread and drink. For those who would like to create their own keepsake bowls, Simply Pottery will sell \$18 tickets, and visitors can paint their own bowl for the event.
