Six Democrats filed for local offices on this year's primary election ballot. They join 10 Republican hopefuls this week, who will be added to the number of candidates who have filed for elective positions this year.

Candidates have until noon Friday to file for an office at the county courthouse in Franklin. The sheriff and county prosecutor are among the more prominent offices up for election this year.

Sheriff seeks seniors willing to help others

Calling all watchdogs, couriers and all-around caring folks.

The Johnson County Sheriff's Office is looking for seniors who might be interested in starting a local chapter of the nationwide program Triad.

Triad allows senior volunteers to run errands and watch out for seniors in their community.

"They would take whatever seniors need and find an avenue to fix it," McLaughlin said.

Volunteers could warn seniors about potential scams in their neighborhood; bring firewood; or pick up prescriptions.

The sheriff's office has wanted to start a local chapter of the national

program for about three years.

But they haven't been able to find volunteers willing to commit time to running the program, he said.

They would need at least four volunteers to get the program started.

McLaughlin said that the volunteers would help determine what the program might look like in Johnson County, as each program differs according to the needs in their community.

Ten volunteers regularly visit seniors in Brown County, where a Triad program has been active for the past seven years, coordinator Carol Morgan said.
