Overflow plan at jail not used yet

A plan put together to lower the number of inmates in the jail has never been tested.

That's because Johnson County jail employees and inmates have seen fewer people in cells and bunks recently.

In the past three months, the number of people in the jail has not come close to what the sheriff deemed full capacity of 305.

The low numbers mean a drop from the summer of 2005, when numbers exceeded capacity by as many as 30 inmates.

When the jail expanded in 2001, the sheriff's office believed the new capacity of 305 wouldn't be reached before 2011.

On Oct. 24, 304 inmates were being held at the county jail.

A committee consisting of police officials and court and prosecutor's office employees met to determine what to do when too many folks were taken to jail.

When that happens, the plan called for releasing non-violent offenders to house arrest and work release before their sentence is up at the jail.

But the plan hasn't been used since the group approved it in September because jail numbers have stayed low since the total of 304 was reached in October.

Since then, the numbers generally have hovered between 250 and 290, according to jail population numbers.

The quiet time likely won't last long, Maj. Dave Emery, jail commander, said. Fewer people come into the jail during winter months than in the summer when numbers jump, he said.

Alpine changes locale

Alpine Electronics in Greenwood has moved to a smaller building that better fits the business' current operations.

The company stopped manufacturing at its 421 N. Emerson Ave. facility in 2004, shifting those operations to Mexico and laying off about 100 workers.

The Emerson Avenue building was about 350,000-square feet, and the majority of that space was used for manufacturing, said Robert Hill, Alpine senior manager of corporate planning and human resources.

The about 100,000 square-foot building at 800 Commerce Parkway West Drive is better suited for Alpine's distribution and quality-control functions, which employ about 50 people, Hill said.

Alpine moved to the Precedent Industrial Park in late December, Hill said.

The Greenwood business retained its employees in the move, Hill said.
