A pioneer of Baroque violin will join the Indianapolis Baroque Orchestra in a March 6 concert at the University of Indianapolis.

Violinist Stanley Ritchie is guest leader and soloist for a program highlighted by Antonio Vivaldi's "The Four Seasons." Aply titled "The Godfather," the concert begins at 7:30 p.m. at the university's Christel DeHaan Fine Arts Center, 1400 E. Hanna Ave.

Ritchie has taught since 1980 at the Indiana University School of Music in Bloomington, and some musicians participating in the concert are current or former Ritchie pupils.

Highly caffeinated comedy takes the stage

The Indiana Repertory Theatre will present "Triple Espresso" starting May 17.

The work has been performed more than 8,500 times and to more than 1.5 million people in 26 cities in four countries.

Created and compiled in 1995 by Bill Arnold, Michael Pearce Donley and Bob Stromberg and directed by William Partlan, "Triple Espresso" tells the rags-to-rags story of Buzz Maxwell, Hugh Butternut and Bobby Bean, an aspiring comedy trio whose bid for showbiz fame and fortune ended in four minutes of magnificent failure on national television.
