# Layup carries Pacers to win

Late shot by Jackson gives Indiana its 30th win of season

Stephen Jackson atoned for a bunch of misses with one clutch play.

Jackson's layup with 2.9 seconds left lifted the Indiana Pacers to a 94-93 victory against the Philadelphia 76ers on Sunday.

Allen Iverson had 33 points and nine assists but couldn't lead the Sixers to their third straight victory.

Anthony Johnson had 18 points and Jackson scored 15 for Indiana, which has won three of four.

Down by one point, the Pacers got possession after a shot-clock violation on Philadelphia with 4.9 seconds left. Sarunas Jasikevicius threw an inbound pass to Jackson, who went around a stumbling Kyle Korver to make an uncontested shot.

"I was 0-for-infinity," Jackson said. "I just wanted to make a shot. We knew they'd switch. I went backdoor and got to the basket. My teammates showed confidence in me to give me the ball. It seemed like I hadn't made a shot all game."

Jackson missed 15 of his first 19 shots before the easy layup. Chris Webber then missed a jumper at the buzzer after an inbound pass from Iverson.

"For that to happen with 4.9 seconds left, it's devastating," Iverson said.

Korver was a surprise presence on the floor at that end, considering he lost his starting job because of his poor defense.

## CG cruises to gymnastics title

The Center Grove girls gymnastics team continued the dominance it has shown all season at Saturday's Columbus East Sectional, winning by a margin of 6.1 points in front of second-place Bloomington South.

On their road to a fourth straight state appearance, the Trojans were

strong in every aspect, winning three of four events and taking the top three places in the all-around.

The No. 3 Trojans placed at least one athlete in the top three of all four events, including the top four positions in the vault and floor exercise.

Senior Megan Roller took first place in the all-around for her seventh consecutive time this season, with a total score of 37.4. She was followed by teammates

Katelyn Fernandes and Angela Blakenship.

"I think we did well," Roller said. "We definitely have some things we can work on for regionals, but it was a nice meet for us."

Center Grove heads back to Columbus East on Saturday for regional competition. The Trojans must place in the top two as a team to move on to the state finals.
