Autopsy: Inmate had heart disease

Man died after seizure in cell

A jail inmate who died Thursday suffered from a medical problem jail officers never had the chance to ask him about.

Preliminary results from an autopsy showed Donny G. Browning had heart disease.

Johnson County Coroner Dave Lutz plans to wait for laboratory tests before issuing a final cause of death, but he believes Browning died of natural causes.

Investigators already reviewed surveillance tapes and interviewed jail workers and inmates and found no foul play involved in his

Browning, 48, died at Johnson Memorial Hospital Thursday afternoon after having a seizure in a holding cell at the Johnson County jail in Franklin.

The Indianapolis man told officers who arrested him that he had no medical problems.

Jail workers would have questioned him further on his medical history, but he was still drunk from the day before, said Maj. Dave Emery, jail commander.

Jail officers typically wait to question inmates who are arrested on alcohol charges until they are sober to ensure they are giving complete answers about their medical history and medications, Emery said.

Then they could arrange for any extra care he needed while in the jail.

In Browning's case, workers would wait 15 hours to question him since he arrived at the jail with a blood-alcohol level of .20, Emery said.

Browning was arrested about 3 p.m. Wednesday outside a Greenwood restaurant on a charge of public intoxication.

Employees at the Steak 'n Shake at 101 N. State Road 135 in Greenwood reported the man was asleep in his car outside the restaurant.

The officers who arrested Browning asked him if he had any medical problems. Browning told them he did not.

Jail inmates do not receive a physical examination when they are brought to the jail, said Doug Cox, chief deputy for the Johnson County Sheriff's Office.

If an inmate describes severe conditions in their medical history, such as a recent heart attack, the inmate will be seen by the nurse on call, Emery said.

Doctors will also often make contact with the inmate's physician to check on medications the inmate says he or she needs.

Browning, 424 S. Oxford St., Indianapolis, died at the hospital at 12:48 p.m. Thursday.

He had been in a holding cell with five other inmates at the jail when some of the inmates saw he was having a seizure. They called for help.
