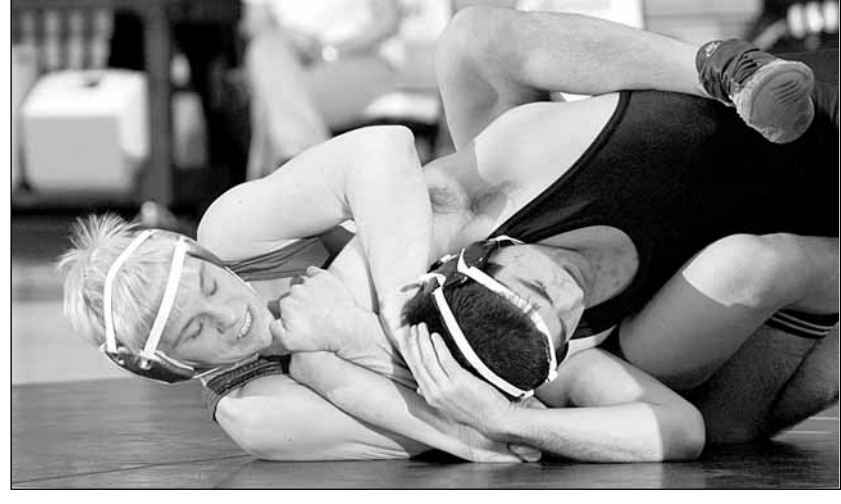
Franklin falls in finals

Cubs, CG can't overcome Avon in wrestling regional

Unable to defend its sectional title, the Franklin Community High School wrestling team was wanting yet another regional title.
Center Grove snapped the Grizzly Cubs' sectional title winning streak Saturday, but the Cubs still had a chance to defend their regional title Wednesday at Avon High School.

matches to take a 28-27 lead into the final match, the 140-pound weight class.
But Avon's Corbin Richards defeated Center Grove senior Ryan Christian by a 3-2 decision to give the Orioles a victory and a spot in the regional final.
The Trojans, Saturday's sectional champion at Mooresville, were trying for their first regional title since 1995. But they suffered a setback in just their second match as junior Jason Cambridge lost by injury default to Avon's Dalton Jones at 152 pounds.
"His was in a scramble, and his feet probably got tangled up," Center Grove coach Cale Hoover said. "We hope for a sprain."

Center Grove had five decisions and recorded two pins, one from junior Blake Harvey at 130 pounds and the other from sophomore Shelby Mappes at 160. Avon notched four decisions and two pins to go along with the injury default.
"We tip our hat to Avon," Hoover said.

"We wrestled tough. I think the injury default made the difference in the match in the back of my mind. Cambridge was doing good in the match.
"But we didn't win when we needed to, and Avon did. Center Grove fell short."
The team semistate competition is at 7 p.m. Wednesday at Avon.
