Greenwood can't hold off Dragons

Greenwood coach Debbie Guckenberger accused her team of going into "coast mode" Tuesday night, and she didn't intend that as a compliment.

Greenwood (7-8) maintained a small but comfortable lead throughout most of its non-conference matchup against New Palestine (6-7).

But once the Dragons increased their level of aggressiveness and figured out how to shut down sophomore Tessa Ratliff, New Palestine slowly took charge in the game's closing minutes and held on for a 52-49 victory.

"They outthusted us and played harder on defense than we played on offense," Guckenberger said. "This was just a lack of effort on our part."

The Dragons and Woodmen traded baskets until New Palestine senior Jenni Tamarr hit a layup that tied the game at 41.

Jamie Unversaw of Greenwood sank two free throws with 3:35 left. But following a timeout, senior Katie Lyons completed a 3-4-3 lead.

Senior Danielle Perry's jump shot following a Woodmen turnover made the Greenwood deficit three points, but Jessica Unversaw answered at the other end with a

Jamie Unversaw led Greenwood in scoring with 18 points, 12 of which came in the second half. Ratliff added 13 points and 11 rebounds. Ratliff had 10 of her 11 rebounds in the first half.

Perry led the Dragons with 20 points, while Lyons added 16.
