## Police: Man, mother arrested

A man and his mother kicked in a Greenwood woman's door, fought with the resident and stopped another woman inside from calling police, police said.

Jason A. Fouty, 24, of New Whiteland, was arrested on a charge of domestic battery, interference with reporting a crime and two counts of possession of marijuana or hashish.

His mother Judith Meade, 45, Indianapolis, was arrested on a charge of residential entry.

Police said an argument started between Fouty, Meade and the woman. Fouty and Meade left the apartment located in the 500 block of Smith Valley Road. They returned, and the woman said that Meade kicked in the door, according to the police report.

Fouty punched the woman in

the jaw and twisted her arm. Another woman who did not reside there tried to call police, but Fouty threw the phone against the wall, breaking it. The resident then ran to a neighboring apartment to call police, according to the report.

Meade and Fouty left the apartment.

The woman was taken to St. Francis Hospital Indianapolis for her injuries.

Police found Fouty and Meade at Fouty's new Whiteland home.

The two told police conflicting stories of who kicked in the door. Both said that Fouty did not hurt the resident's arm, according to the report.

Police found a small amount of

marijuana and a pipe with marijuana residue when they searched Fouty, according to the report.

Meade and Fouty were arrested and taken to the Johnson County jail.

Fouty is being held on \$12,000 bond. Meade was released on \$3,000 bond.

### Four local agencies to receive FEMA aid

Four Johnson County social service agencies will use \$29,052 in federal money for emergency food and shelter programs and rent and utility assistance.

The county receives the money from the Federal Emergency Management Agency each year, and local agencies meet to decide how to use the money based on county needs,

Human Service director Susan Hood said.

Human Services, Turning Point, InterChurch Food Pantry and Christian Help each will receive some of the money, she said. Human Services will get the largest amount because the non-profit organization offers assistance for food, shelter, rent and utilities.

Emergency shelter and rent assistance were considered the greatest needs, Hood said. Currently, the county's rental assistance and emergency shelter programs receive less money than food and utility programs.

Less money was designated for food programs for the coming year because there are several food pantries in the area, she said.

The agencies will receive the money in the spring, Hood said.

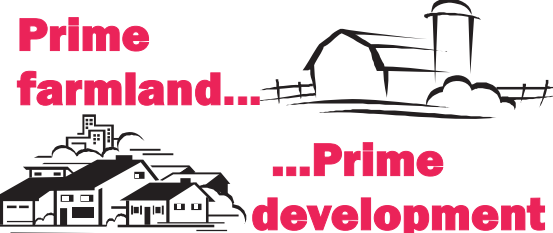

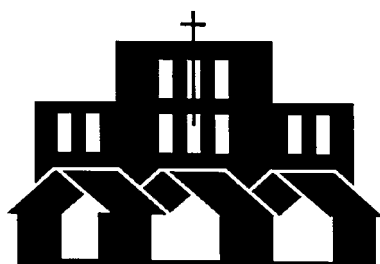
