Man sentenced in molestation case

Felon pleads guilty to lesser charge after Edinburg victim refuses to testify

A man accused of raping a teenager in Edinburg more than 15 years ago will serve two years' probation on a lesser charge.

Terry Roberts, 57, pleaded guilty to battery on a child younger than 14 years of age, a Class D felony. He was sentenced to 22 days in jail, which he had already served, and the remainder of the two-year sentence on probation.

Roberts was accused of raping

a 14-year-old boy at his apartment in 1991. The teen reported the incident in 1992, but police could not find Roberts for 13 years.

The sheriff's office received a tip that Roberts was working and living in Florida in October 2005, and two deputies were sent to pick him up.

Roberts, who now lives in North Vernon, was arrested on a charge of child molestation.

Prosecutors agreed to allow Roberts to plead guilty to a lesser charge with no jail time because they didn't think they could win the case at trial, deputy prosecu-

tor Daylon Welliver said.

Police did not find evidence or a confession, meaning the case was based solely on the victim's story. The victim refused to testify in court and had served a long prison sentence, making him less credible to a jury, Welliver said.

In 1992, the teen told police he went with Roberts to buy a video game in Greenwood. The teen had done work for Roberts, and the video game was his payment, according to court records.

On the way to Greenwood, Roberts fondled the teen in the car, according to court records.

The boy asked him to stop. Roberts took the boy back to his apartment in Edinburg, where the teen said Roberts raped him, according to court records.

The teen waited several months to tell relatives about the incident because he said Roberts had threatened to kill his mother if he told anyone, according to court records.

Edinburg police asked the prosecutor to file two counts of child molestation. Roberts had already left, and the department didn't receive any tips on his whereabouts for years.
