## No arrests in station break-in

Three handguns and a pair of night-vision goggles stolen from the Prince's Lakes Police Department remain missing.

No arrests have been made after a joint county-federal investigation.

Police believe a burglar or burglars broke into the police department in the town hall building in November. Three police-issued handguns were stolen from a key-locked safe after the thief found the key in the office.

The guns' ownership paperwork also was taken from the safe.

The burglar also stole night-vision goggles from an unlocked police car. The department had the military equipment on loan from Crane Naval Surface Warfare Center.

The town had to pay the center

more than \$2,000 to cover the loss.

The town council reprimanded Town Marshal Greg Souther and suspended him for two days without pay this month.

In a special session, council members decided against demoting Souther.

A council member suggested a probation period or not renewing Souther's contract as marshal. Both ideas were discussed and dismissed.

"I'm just devastated," Souther said. "I have to wake up with myself every day knowing those guns are out there."

Police ended the investigation without any suspects or evidence suggesting how the thief broke into the office. The theft was reported to the FBI, which logged the guns' serial numbers into a database.

The guns will be flagged as stolen if anyone attempts to sell them or if they turn up in a police search.

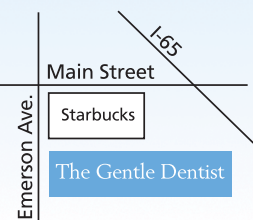
