 Shawn Marion added 23 points, Amare Stoudemire 22 and Leandro Barbosa had 19 for the Suns, who improved to 34-4 since opening the season 1-5. Phoenix, which had a 15-game win streak earlier this season, also matched a franchise record with their ninth straight road win and are 20-1 vs. Eastern Conference teams.
 LeBron James scored 30 points to lead the Cavaliers, who were within four points going into the fourth. However, they couldn't match the Suns' blazing up-and-down pace and managed just 13 points in the final 12 minutes.
 The Suns' winning streak is the league's longest since Kobe Bryant, Shaquille O'Neal and the Los Angeles Lakers reeled off 19 in a row during the 1999-2000 season.

Patient offense helps Grizzlies win again

 Easy-does-it is what really has done it for the Franklin College men's basketball team this season.

The Grizzlies maximized their methodical offense and scrappy defense in topping visiting non-conference foe Clarke College (Iowa) 72-53 at the Spurlock Center on Saturday afternoon. FC's third straight victory improved it 11-8 overall. The Crusaders dropped to 5-16.

"We play our best offensive basketball when we are patient and disciplined and generally play longer possessions," said Franklin head coach Kerry Prather after the game. "It took us a while (this season) to figure it out, but once we had, we're a pretty good offensive team."

"We've gotten to a point that a longer rotation of guys is producing every game for us. Consistency is the trick to this."

The game was close for most of the first half with the Grizzlies hitting most of their shots from outside the lane, including a trio of 3-point hoops, while Clarke scored six of its eight baskets in the paint.

Leading 23-20 with 4½ minutes left in the opening period, Franklin manufactured a 15-2 run, sparked by a reserve effort from junior Jon Neill and freshman guard Jeff Gasser, who combined for 13 of those 15 points. The other basket was by junior forward Marty Young, who had seven first-half points and a team-best 13 on the day. The hosts shot 56 percent from the floor during the first 20 minutes.

After the intermission, the Grizzlies

continued taking advantage of turnovers they created, building their advantage to as many as 22 points.

Clarke outscored Franklin 23-14 in a span of 10-plus minutes to close to within 13 at 64-51 with 3:40 to go, but the Grizzlies responded with an 8-2 run as sophomore point guard Jace Redman scored six of his 12 points to close out the game.

Following Young and Redman, senior guard Luke Tudor and Neill added 11 points and sophomore guard Dustin Marshall chipped in 10. DeMonte Bynum was the only Crusader in double figures with 14 points.

"I thought that for big stretches in each half, we did what we had to do. We played well on both ends," Prather said.

Franklin resumes its Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference schedule Wednesday when Rose-Hulman visits.
