However, Jones hit a pair of free throws and a buzzer-beating 3-pointer to give the Sparkplugs a 38-28 advantage. In the third quarter, Indian Creek

freshman Kylee Hamilton put on an offensive display by scoring 21 points to cut the Speedway lead to just one point, 55-54, with less than two minutes to play in the third quarter. However, the Sparkplugs took back control with a 13-4 run to push the lead back to double-digits at 68-58 in the first minute of the fourth quarter. They then dashed any hopes of another Indian Creek surge by hitting 15 of 16 free throws in the quarter. Hamilton finished with a team-high 31 points and seven rebounds, while Chinn finished with 13 points. Ferris said she hopes that her team will remember that lesson as it prepares to host MHC rival Hauser at 2:30 p.m. Saturday. That game and the following game against Triton Central are important if Indian Creek is to compete for a conference title.

The Tigers took the lead for good on junior Courtnee Howard's 3-point basket with 4:11 left. "She got too many open shots," White said. Senior Heather Dowell led Edinburgh with 17 points. Senior Hilary Stinson added 13, while freshman Emily Owens had 10. Crothersville was led by freshman Brooke Prather's game-high 24 points. Howard had 10. Up next for Edinburgh is a Mid-Hoosier Conference game at Morris-town on Saturday night.
