Two Warriors advance in state wrestling finals

Whiteland senior Matthew Fields gets one more try to do something he's never accomplished: win a state wrestling championship. Fields, wrestling at 119 pounds, beat Centerville's Joe Brown by technical fall in the first round of the IHSAA individual wrestling state finals Friday night at Conoco Fieldhouse. Fields won't be alone in his bid. Senior teammate Travis Thomas will join Fields in an attempt to become Whiteland's first state champions since 2002. Thomas secured a takedown with 1 second left in overtime to beat Lafayette Jefferson's Travis DePew 5-3 and advance at 215 pounds. "It's great that both Matt and I advanced," Thomas said. "He came out ready, and so did I." Johnson County's other representative, Center Grove senior Blake Harvey, was stopped in his try at 130 pounds. Harvey, in his first state finals, was beaten by undefeated Brandon Brown, a junior from Carroll (Fort Wayne). Fields (38-1), who has finished sixth and eighth in two previous trips to the state meet, had no trouble with his opponent. An aggressive starter, Fields admittedly had a slow start against Centerville's Brown, and after a minute of wrestling there was no score. Fields said he was looking for a weakness in Brown, which didn't take long to find. "I was taking it easy and discovered he didn't guard his legs," Fields said. "I also found out he had one move, an underhook, but nothing more."

The Whiteland senior exploited Brown's weaknesses and after a takedown and a nearfall was up 5-0. Fields' lead soon grew to where he was up 17-1, giving him a technical fall with 1:02 left in the match. Fields, who said he knew nothing about Brown entering the match, admitted he knew he could win after the first nearfall. "I had a feeling I'd be all right after that," Fields said. "I felt pretty good about it." As effortless as Fields' match was, it took a little longer for Whiteland coach Dave Thompson to be optimistic. "I wasn't as confident until after the first period," Thompson said. "We knew we had him after that. Of course, Matt was a lot closer to the match than I was, so he could feel confident." Fields will face Columbia City's Eli Michel in today's quarterfinals. Thomas' match was arguably one of the most exciting of the night. Trailing 3-1 with 10 seconds left in the third period, Thomas caught the tiring DePew by the legs and secured a takedown to tie the match. Thomas attacked in overtime, finally getting the winning takedown just before the buzzer sounded. "(DePew) was tired, but I was too," Thomas said. "I knew I had to do something because he was tiring fast, and I decided to push it hard. "He was really tough." Thomas (35-2) now takes on North Central's Luke Watkins (14-0) in the quarterfinals. Thompson said he wasn't worried about Thomas' match even when it went into overtime. "He does what he has to do to win," Thompson said. "Now we're going to get ready (for today)."

A mistake hurt Harvey. Down 2-1 in the first period against Carroll's Brown, Harvey had a chance at a takedown, but he got caught out at the edge of the mat, and Brown took him down. Instead of being up 3-2, Harvey was down 4-1 and struggled to stay with Brown the rest of the way before Brown won by a technical fall when he went up 18-3. "It was a fundamental mistake," Center Grove coach Cale Hoover said. "That second takedown was the turning point of the match. Blake was very capable of beating (Brown)." Harvey bowed out of his first state tournament with a 3-7 record. Despite losing, Harvey relished the experience of going to the finals. "This has been a fun year," Harvey said. "It's everything I thought it would be. I would be liar if I said I didn't want to win, but I can honestly say I didn't have any regrets or any what-ifs. I left that on the mat."
