With a first-place finish in Saturday's IHSAA wrestling semistate at Evansville, Whiteland senior Matthew Fields will join two other Johnson County athletes at the state finals. Fields (37-1) defeated Alex Weinzapfel of Evansville Mater Dei 5-0 in overtime for first place in the 119-pound weight class. He and senior teammate Travis Thomas, along with Center Grove senior Blake Harvey, will represent Johnson County at Conesco Fieldhouse this weekend in the IHSAA individual state championships. The top four semistate place winners in each weight class at Evansville advanced to the finals. Thomas (34-2), wrestling at 215 pounds, dropped a 2-1 decision to Mater Dei's Zach Goebel for second place. And at 130 pounds, Center Grove senior Blake Harvey (38-6) finished fourth. First-round action at the state finals begins at 6 p.m. Friday and concludes at 7:30 p.m. Saturday. Center Grove had seven wrestlers competing at the semistate; Whiteland, four; Franklin, three; and Indian Creek had two.

Conference standings, one game behind Warren Central. Center Grove trailed 34-31 at the half as the Patriots connected on 7 of 11 3-pointers in the first two periods. Seniors Tyler Kitchel and Andrew Bowman combined for 43 points to spur the Trojans' second-half comeback. Kitchel had a game-high 26 points, and Bowman added 17 and pulled down 12 rebounds. The Trojans shot 63 percent in the second half and their efficient passing enabled better shot selection. Terre Haute North was led by forward Nate Blake who scored 16 points. The Patriots were without head coach Jim Jones, who was sitting out a one-game suspension by the IHSAA after being ejected from North's loss to Evansville Reitz a week ago. Center Grove (15-2, 5-1) will host Mooresville at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday.
