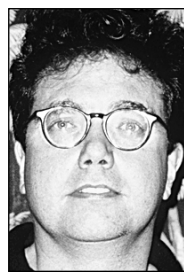


TV Land sits down with Jerry Seinfeld

Jerry Seinfeld appears on the second-season premiere of "Sit Down Comedy with David Steinberg" (10 p.m., TV Land). Steinberg is no stranger to the talk-show circuit.

A celebrated comedian-comedian, he appeared on Johnny Carson's "Tonight Show" more than any other comic with the exception of Bob Hope.

A prolific director of TV commercials and sitcoms, Steinberg has earned Emmy Awards and Directors Guild Awards for his work on "Seinfeld," "Mad About You," "Curb Your Enthusiasm" and many other shows.

Rare among talk-show hosts, Steinberg is a great listener. And rarer still for a comic, he doesn't infuse his talk show with prepackaged bits. As a result, he puts his guests and audience at ease, and something known as conversation usually follows.

Jerry Seinfeld opens to Steinberg about his family and his relationship with his father, a businessman in the sign business.

While a young Jerry Seinfeld felt compelled to be funny around his friends, he seemed embarrassed to make jokes around the house, particularly in front of his father, whom he considered a natural comic.

So his parents were surprised when he announced that he would embark on a career in stand-up. After all, they had lived with him for 20-odd years, and he had never said or done anything remotely amusing.

But within four years of this announcement, Seinfeld would make his debut on "The Tonight Show," and he would be on his way.

Like professionals, the two men make it all seem natural. As Seinfeld observes, comedy is fun and easy only if you're good at it. If you are not, stand-up can be the most unendurable profession in the world.

He also remarks that the best thing about being a comedian is the opportunity to sit around and talk with other comedians. That seems to be the whole point of Steinberg's pleasant, witty and engaging talk show.

The makers of the 90-minute film "The Marines" (9 p.m., WFYI, WTU) speak with more than two dozen current members of the corps about the unique history, traditions and camaraderie of the Marines.

It visits three Marine facilities to explore the rite of passage of boot camp and the rigorous training used to instill a warrior ethos into an exceptionally loyal, skilled breed of combatants.

They've promised us plenty of answers on tonight's new episode of "Lost" (10 p.m., ABC, TV-14). But I'm so confused that I'm not sure I even know the questions.

But just because I'm baffled doesn't mean I'm not entertained.

CHICAGO For Hudson, all roads lead back to church

I don't smoke," Hudson told a boisterous crowd at Progressive Baptist Church on Chicago's south side on Monday night. "I'm not having no club party; I better have a praise party."

Hudson headlined a gospel concert named in her honor, "An Evening of Praise with Jennifer Hudson," accompanied by the acclaimed Soul Children of Chicago.

After winning a Golden Globe last month, Hudson is the favorite to take home the Oscar for best supporting actress for her performance in "Dreamgirls."

Many of the more than 3,000 people in the audience Monday were non-church members drawn in to hear Hudson and others sing.

Trump and World Wrestling Entertainment owner Vince McMahon will pick a wrestler to represent them in the ring April 1 at Wrestlemania 23 at Detroit's Ford Field, The Detroit News reported.

If their pick is beaten in the "Battle of the Billionaires," the loser will get his head shaved after the match, the Detroit Free Press reported Monday.

WWE spokesman Gary Davis said the date of the event had prompted speculation that it was a hoax. But it's not an April Fool's Day joke, he said.

"If Trump loses, he shaves his head," he said.

The announcement of the match was made on a WWE television program that aired over the weekend.

FORT LAUDERDALE, Fla. Judges to hear cases on burial, baby paternity

The late Anna Nicole Smith has the right to rest in peace and tranquility a judge says, but the question over her burial is far from settled.

The long-distance battles over what to do with Smith's body and the paternity of her infant daughter took place Tuesday in courtrooms in Florida and California.

Smith's estranged mother, Virgie Arthur, and Smith's boyfriend, Howard K. Stern, were set to square off here. Lawyers for Stern were also set to argue in Los Angeles with those for Smith's ex-companion over who is the father of her infant daughter, Dannielynn.

Stern wants Smith buried in the Bahamas in a plot that was purchased next to her son, Daniel, who died in September. Arthur wants her brought home to her native Texas.

In Los Angeles, the dispute over who is the father of 5-month-old Dannielynn was scheduled to be taken up in a closed-door hearing.

Craig Ferguson decided not to poke fun at Britney Spears for at least one night.

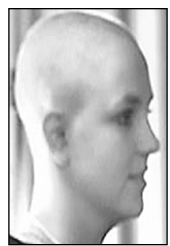
