

Do Golden Globes need a comb-over?

The award season begins in earnest with the "64th Annual Golden Globe Awards" (8 p.m., NBC).

There was a time when the Golden Globes were an international joke, but that time has passed.

Then came a time when the Globes were a guilty pleasure, a chance to watch celebrities vie for a largely meaningless award and the possibility that some of them might drink too much and get plastered in the process. But that, too, was a long time ago.

Now the Globes are taken seriously. They represent an early onset of Oscar fever. And we all know how important that is!

Why am I yawning? In many ways, the Golden Globes have followed a celebrity trajectory not unlike that of Donald Trump. In the 1980s, both the gilded Donald and the Golden Globes were seen as a symbol of zircon excess.

They seemed perfectly suited for the era's emerging tabloid culture. Trump conducted his divorce proceedings on the front page. Globe voters appeared to be on the take, and they bestowed their highest honors on Pia Zadora. But eras end and ersatz infamy subsides.

After a decade or so in purgatory, both the Globes and the Donald returned, stronger than ever. In fact, both blossomed on NBC. But that, too, seems a long time ago.

Has anyone really cared about "The Apprentice" since Omarosa's last tirade? And can anyone remember who won Golden Globes last year? Or recall anything fun or outrageous or scandalous about last year's Globes?

Both "The Apprentice" and the Globes seem to be about publicity for publicity's sake. As such, both ventures have a hollow, been-there-done-that feeling to them.

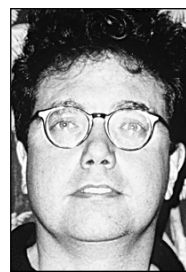

Mirren basks in glow of Golden Globe nominations

Oh, to be Helen Mirren this weekend.

It started Friday morning, when her movie "The Queen" topped the list of nominees for the British Academy Film Awards, the British equivalent of the Academy Awards.

On Friday afternoon, the American Film Institute honored another Mirren movie, "Elizabeth I," as one of the year's 10 best TV productions.

Then Friday night, the Broadcast Film Critics Association named that film the best picture made for television, and Mirren herself was honored as best actress for "The Queen."

Her golden weekend continued Saturday night, when American Cinematheque threw a sold-out tribute to her at the historic Egyptian Theatre in Hollywood.

Mirren was set to collect a statuette Sunday from the Los Angeles Film Critics Association, which named her best actress for "The Queen."

And she's a triple nominee for today's Golden Globes for "The Queen" and "Elizabeth I," and television film "Prime Suspect: The Final Act."

"Oh my goodness," Mirren said before entering the tribute Saturday night. "There seems to be nonstop fittings for clothes."

Stallone shows support for Everton soccer team

As L.A. prepares to welcome David Beckham, Sylvester Stallone took to a Liverpool soccer field on Sunday.

At the start of Everton Football Club's Premier-ship match against Reading, the "Rocky" star held up a blue-and-white Everton scarf to loud cheers from the 30,000-strong crowd.

Stallone, 60, was not the only American on the field. Both teams were fielding American goalkeepers — Tim Howard for Everton and Marcus Hahnemann for Reading.

The actor is due in London later in the week for the British premiere of "Rocky Balboa," his sixth film about the blue-collar Philadelphia boxer.

Soccer's profile in the United States got a boost this week when former England captain Beckham announced he was leaving Real Madrid for the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer.

Beckham's wife Victoria, the former Posh Spice of the Spice Girls, was greeted by paparazzi when she arrived in L.A. on Saturday.

Giada De Laurentiis, the Food Network chef with the million-dollar smile and friendly, easygoing nature, has kicked off a new series with "Giada's Weekend Getaways" (9 p.m. Fridays).

Viewers can expect trips to a fish market in Seattle and doughnuts at Dahlia. Fly-fishing in Jackson Hole, Wyo., and pecan-crusted trout. Even salsa dancing in Miami Beach, Fla., and vodka-tasting in the icy Vod Box at Nic's Martini Lounge in Venice Beach, Calif.

"The show was a collaborative idea between the Food Network and myself," De Laurentiis said. "Travel shows are so popular that we decided to combine travel and food into a new show that offers ideas, food and great scenery."

In "Giada's Weekend Getaways," De Laurentiis travels to interesting getaway destinations for three-day visits.

"We'll take you to hot spots and local best-kept-secrets, and we'll be checking out everything from regional cuisine to exotic drinks to must-see sites — like the fish market in Seattle."

from New York City to Napa, Calif., Charleston, S.C., to Chicago.

"It's a chronological show," De Laurentiis said. "We go Friday through Sunday and usually feature eight to 10 things on the show: four or five things to do while you're there, and four or five places to eat, special dishes

to order, even some cooking tips.

"Every place has its own characteristics, its own food or atmosphere that makes it special," she said. "We chose places, but kind of decide what else to do once we're there, once we have input from people who live there."

"You find out a lot by listening to the locals."

As a chef — De Laurentiis trained at Le Cordon Bleu in Paris — she's had a lot of "Getaway" fun watching other chefs who are in the spotlight each week.

"That's just a wonderful aspect of the show — watching chefs as they create their specialties. It can be something simple that tastes amazing, or something really intricate, very gourmet," she said.

De Laurentiis, who also hosts Food Network's "Everyday Italian" cooking show, said one of her favorite "Getaway" stops was at Dahlia, Tom Douglas' restaurant in Seattle.

"He makes the most unbelievable doughnuts," she said.

"Mmm, they are just unbelievable. You might think that sounds simple, but these aren't just any doughnuts."

And the risotto with truffles at Casa Tua in Miami Beach is

"absolutely out of this world," she said, then laughed and added: "And in Austin, Texas, there's a dive-y kind of place, a honky tonk called The Broken Spoke, that had the most amazing chicken-fried steak you'll ever eat."

"The producers were a little nervous about me eating chicken-fried steak coated in corn flakes, but it was great. That's how they make it in Texas, and that's what 'Getaways' lets you see."
