
Former local swimmers shine in meet

• Indiana University junior **Tyler Skelton** was third of 11 competitors in the long jump (22 feet, 1/2 inch) and 17th of 21 in the 60-yard dash (7.41) at the Indiana Indoor Track and Field

• Iowa State freshman diver **Tien Tran**, competing at the Georgia Diving Invitational, was fifth of 29 divers in the 1-meter competition, 10th of 28 at 3 meters and eighth of 14 from the platform.

• The Ohio Wesleyan women's basketball team (7-6) defeated Case-Western Reserve (64-63) and Oberlin (86-55) and lost to Denison (67-61). Stacy Aaron had 10 points (3 for 7 field-goal attempts, 2 for 6 from 3-point range, 2 for 2 from the freethrow line), three rebounds, one steal and one assist in 30 minutes in the three contests.

• The College of Mount St. Joseph women's basketball team (5-8, 1-5) lost to Franklin (70-61) and Defiance (74-65). Maria Eichold led the Lions with 19 points (8 for 15, 0 for 0, 3 for 3) in 33 minutes in the loss to the Grizzlies. She had six rebounds and one steal. In the loss to the Yellow Jackets, she had 10 points

(5 for 9, 0 for 0, 0 for 3), five rebounds, one assist and one steal in 28 minutes.

• The University of Indianapolis women's basketball team (8-3, 2-2) won 67-35 against Oakland City and 65-43 against St. Joseph's. **Deanna Thomson** had 13 rebounds, seven steals, four assists, one blocked shot and three points (0 for 7, 0 for 1, 3 for 4) in 67 minutes in the two wins. Freshman Molly Lauck had two points (1 for 1) and one rebound in 12 minutes for St. Joseph's (3-9, 0-4).

• Competing in the 24-team Midwest Wrestling Classic at the University of Indianapolis, sixth-seeded Mike Horton placed third at 157 pounds, winning five of six matches. At 197 pounds, **Justin Cooper** won one match and lost two. The Greyhounds finished in ninth place.

• University of Indianapolis swimmer Aaron Neeman was 15th of 38 in the 200 freestyle (1:50.99), 11th of 24 in the 500 freestyle (5:04.05) and 11th of 20 in the 200 backstroke (2:04.66) at the University of Indianapolis Invitational.

• Freshman **Jessica Huffman** was named Ohio Valley Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week and, for the third time, OVC Freshman of the Week. However, her Eastern Illinois women's basketball team (5-11, 2-5) lost three games, bowing to Murray State (93-67), Southeast Missouri (77-60) and Austin Peay (74-62).

Huffman led the Panthers in

scoring in the Southeast Missouri and Austin Peay losses with 19 points (7 for 15, 2 for 2, 3 for 4) and 14 points (6 for 12, 2 for 4, 0 for 0), respectively. She had four rebounds, four assists and one steal in 52 minutes in the two games.

In the loss to Murray, she had 10 points (4 for 10, 0 for 2, 2 for 3), two assists and three steals in 27 minutes.

• Brescia College's women's basketball team (8-11) lost to Cumberland (72-59) and the University of the Cumberlands (68-51). Jennifer Patrick had 10 points (4 for 13, 2 for 9, 0 for 0), nine rebounds, two assists and two steals in 56 minutes in the losses.

• Ohio State senior diver Anesa Beard was third of eight at 1 meter and fourth of eight at 3 meters in the Buckeyes' 163-137 dual meet win against Ohio University.

• Wabash freshman wrestler **Cody Johnson** won two matches and lost two at 197 pounds to finish in fourth place at the Midwest Open Tournament at DesPlaines, Ill.

• The Purdue wrestling team improved its dual meet record to 10-0 with wins against Eastern Illinois (34-8), Appalachian State (28-9) and Cleveland State (30-6). Sean Schmaltz, wrestling at 133 pounds, won against Eastern Illinois (9-5) and Appalachian (8-6) and lost to Cleveland State (3-1 in overtime).

• Joe Ramey saw his first action for the Franklin College basketball team (7-6, 3-2), scoring four points (1 for 1, 0 for 0, 2 for 3) and grabbing a rebound in two minutes in the Grizzlies' 62-59 win against Manchester.

J.R. Angle played seven minutes in Iowa's 64-62 basketball win against Michigan State and scored four points (2 for 4).

• Wabash College sophomore wrestler Robert Arnett won five matches and lost one at 285 pounds to finish in third place in the Midwest Open Tournament at DesPlaines, Ill. He pinned three of his opponents. He lost both of his matches at the Midwest Wrestling Classic at the University of Indianapolis, bowing 5-1 to Central Missouri and 10-7 to Cumberland.

• The Marian College men's basketball team (7-7, 2-4) lost to Indiana Wesleyan (67-33) and St. Francis in overtime (78-75).

Matt Allee led the Knights with nine rebounds and had 12 points (5 for 12, 2 for 4, 0 for 0), two steals and one assist in 41 minutes against St. Francis. In the loss to Indiana Weslevan he had one rebound, one assist and one blocked shot in 21 minutes. He took five shots and was scoreless.

Enrollment at Duke not hurt by case

The lacrosse sexual offense case doesn't seem to have had a serious effect on the number of high school students applying to Duke University.

Nearly 18,500 students applied for 1,665 places for the fall, second only to last year's record of 19,387, Duke officials announced Tuesday.

"I was less certain about where exactly we'd end up this year" given the circumstances, said Christoph Guttentag, dean of undergraduate admissions. "I think that the change this year is very much within the context of what we see from year to year."

Spring classes resumed Wednesday at Duke, and much has changed in the criminal case against three lacrosse players since students and faculty left for winter break last month.

Rape charges against the players were dropped after the woman who said she was attacked at a team party in March wavered on some key details.

Then the Durham County (N.C.) prosecutor was charged with ethics violations, and a group of district attorneys in North Carolina urged him to recuse himself from the divisive case.

University officials last week invited two of the players, Collin Finnerty and Reade Seligmann, to return to the Durham campus as students in good standing. The third lacrosse player, Dave Evans, graduated in May.
