percent of their high school graduating class.  
Money's father, Lee, said school performance comes fairly easy for his son. While math is his strong suit, Lee Money said his son is especially dedicated in areas he's not so strong in. For example, he said Adam will stay up late to finish a third or fourth draft of a paper until it's perfect.  
"We ask Adam always to do his best," Lee Money said. "His best in school work is getting A's, and his best on the athletic field is a fairly good performance. It does create some expectations for him, but we have never asked him to do anything other than his best, which fortunately has taken him far."  
With his high academic performance, Money asked Whiteland football coach Darrin Fisher to send highlight tapes to Ivy League programs after the 2005-06 season.  
Harvard University and University of Pennsylvania coaches visited Money at the high school. Yale's recruiting coordinator met with him at his home.

In most recruiting visits, the player's coach does the selling. With Yale, Money had to sell himself. And the coach liked enough of what he saw to invite the Moneys to New Haven, Conn., for a campus visit.  
After a visit with his parents last month, Money said it didn't take him long to know Yale was the place for him.  
"The people, the campus, it all kind of clicked for me; and they gave me the opportunity to come play football, and I took it and ran," he said.  
During the campus tour, Money received a sampling of the long list of prestigious alumni Yale, including five U.S. presidents.  
"They talked about how George W.

Bush was in this fraternity and some secret society, and I was like, 'Wow. I'm here where the president was when he was younger,' Money said. "I'm still trying to wrap my mind around it."

During Money's visit, there were about 20 other prospective football players. Only four were offered spots on the team.

Money was Whiteland's only two-way starter, but Yale's coaches envisioned him sticking to defense.

"We're both proud of him and humbled with the opportunity that has been offered to him," Lee Money said. "The competition for those opportunities at Yale is significant, and they are all great kids."

"He's always been a very driven kid," said Adam's mother, Cindy Money. "He's always looking for the next challenge."

That will include playing in the nation's oldest college football rivalry. Every year, Yale and Harvard play in "The Game."

With attendance numbers usually nearing 55,000 for "The Game," Money said it's going to be quite a shock to see that many people in the stands.

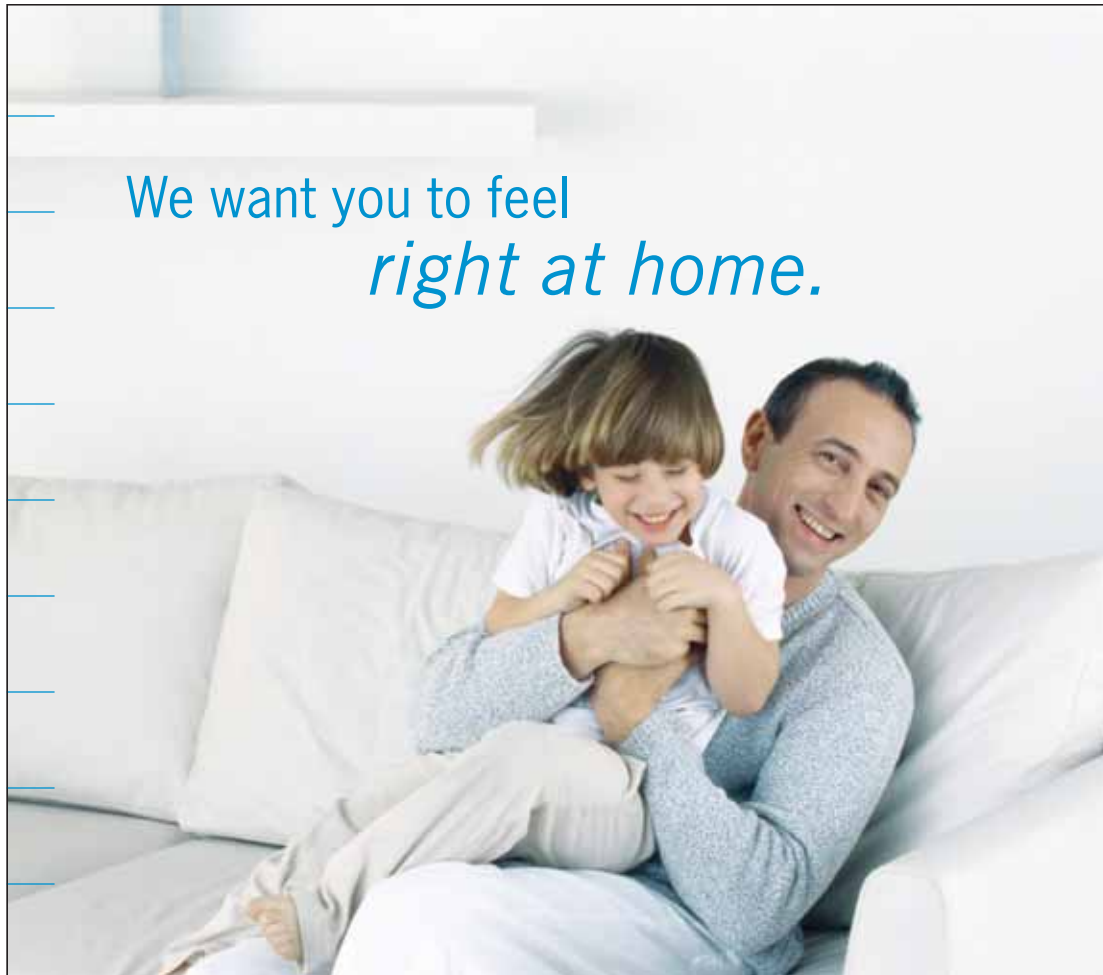
"We had 2,500 at our regional game (against Cathedral), and I thought that was pretty big," he said. "It's going to be a surreal experience."

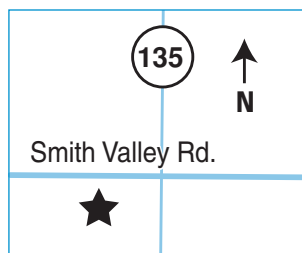
