## Police: Woman killed husband

### Two deaths believed to be murder-suicide

A southside woman shot her husband of 30 years twice before killing herself Friday evening, police said.

Larry Kinnaird, 58, died after his wife, Sharon Sue Kinnaird, 58, shot him, Indianapolis Metropolitan Police Department Lt. Doug Scheffel said.

Sharon Kinnaird had called her daughter on Friday and told her she was having problems with Larry Kinnaird, Scheffel said.

The conversation prompted the daughter to contact her brother and sister, and all three went to check on their parents, Scheffel said. Police were contacted about 7:40 p.m. Friday, he said.

The three siblings found

Sharon and Larry Kinnaird dead in their Indianapolis home on Whitaker Valley Boulevard, near Stop 11 Road and Emerson Avenue, Scheffel said.

Sharon Kinnaird had a single gunshot wound, he said.

Information about the location of the gunshot wounds was not available Sunday afternoon, Scheffel said.

She told her daughter that Larry Kinnaird had been having an affair, he said.

Police believe Sharon Kinnaird killed Larry Kinnaird based on the conversations she had with her daughter on Friday, Scheffel said. The revolver believed to be used in the shooting was found near Sharon Kinnaird.

Larry Kinnaird was a route salesman for Frito-Lay, and Sharon Kinnaird worked as a cashier at Kroger.

Police are interviewing family members but are confident the deaths were the result of a murder-suicide, Scheffel said.

## New clerk's office position approved

Adding a county employee should speed up the process of filing court cases and preparing for elections, the county clerk said.

Clerk Jill Jackson will hire a worker to help with duties in the courthouse, such as filing court cases and processing voter registrations.

Her office received complaints last year from judges and the Johnson County Bar Association when court cases were filed late or fines ordered by judges were recorded a month or more after state law allows.

With workers on leave for medical reasons and an increase in the number of cases filed in the county, Jackson asked county officials for help.

The number of cases filed in

the county increased 6 percent from 2005 to 2006. Since a full-time employee was removed from Jackson's office in 2003, the number of cases filed increased nearly 22 percent, according to Jackson and preliminary estimates of cases filed in 2006.

Jackson asked for one employee at \$23,000-per-year who could learn all the duties of the office and help where needed.

The county council approved her request unanimously Jan. 8.

Jackson will hire an employee as soon as possible.

Some of her first goals will be: making sure court cases are filed on time, recording the court fines or judgments given by county judges within the 14-day deadline Indiana law requires and sorting through as many as 1,400 voter registration forms that pile up in the office over three weeks, she said.


