Franklin College men's basketball coach Kerry Prather makes no secret that **Grizzlies 68** the most effec-

tive way his **Engineers 51** team plays is to make every possession count.

And if it takes the entire 35 seconds on the shot clock, that's fine. After playing a cat-and-mouse

game in the first half, the Grizzlies ran away from Heartland Collegiate Athletic Conference foe Rose-Hulman for a 68-51 win Wednesday, giving them their fourth straight victory.

Bonds and the Giants, who agreed to financial terms Dec. 7, said Monday the drawn-out agreement had been finalized.

Congress to Mitchell: We'll be watching

Congress is monitoring George Mitchell's investigation of steroids in baseball and could intervene if he doesn't get more cooperation,

two lawmakers told the former Senate Majority Leader.

The leaders of a House subcommittee that conducted hearings on steroids in 2005 pledged their support for Mitchell in a letter sent to him Tuesday and released to the media Wednesday.

"We sincerely hope that all relevant parties will work constructively to facilitate the completion of your investigation and your ongoing efforts to clean up the sport," wrote House Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Commerce, Trade, and Consumer Protection chairman Bobby Rush, a Democrat from Illinois, and ranking Republican Cliff Stearns

Yankee Stadium to host 2008 All-Star game

Yankee Stadium is going out with an All-Star salute.

The beloved old ballpark will host the 79th major-league All-Star game on July 15, 2008, the final season before the New York Yankees move into a new stadium being built across the street in the Bronx.

Baseball commissioner Bud Selig and New York Mayor Michael Bloomberg were on hand Wednesday at City Hall for the announcement, which had been expected for months.

It will be the fourth All-Star game at Yankee Stadium, which opened in 1923 and underwent an extensive renovation in the mid-1970s. The most recent summer showcase in The House That Ruth Built was in 1977, when the National League won 7-5 for the sixth of 11 consecutive victories.

Chargers linebacker sues police officer, city

San Diego Chargers linebacker Steve Foley sued the city of Coronado, Calif., and the off-duty police officer who shot him three times outside his home, his attorney said Wednesday.

The civil suit accuses Officer Aaron Mansker of negligence and excessive force and seeks unspecified damages from the officer and the city.

Foley was shot early Sept. 3 near his home in suburban Poway by Mansker, a 23-year-old rookie Coronado police officer who was off-duty at the time and suspected the linebacker of drunken driving.

Mansker told investigators that he shot Foley after the player reached for his waistband. Investigators said Foley was unarmed.

Foley missed the season and wasn't paid his \$775,000 salary.

NASCAR makes change to qualifying provisional

NASCAR changed its Nextel Cup past champions provisional Wednesday to limit it to only six uses per season.

There had previously been no limit to how many times a past Cup champion could use the provisional to ensure a spot in the field each week. The provisional was set aside for the 43rd spot in the race to the most recent former champion who did not qualify based on speed.

Now, a driver can use the spot only six times in a year, and the limit also applies to the entire team so that a car owner can't use it multiple times.

"As NASCAR seeks to place more emphasis on competition, we have decided the time is right to limit the number of provisionals allowed," said Robin Pemberton, NASCAR's competition director.
