be added to the building during the project as new construction. The school will need demolition work, new paint and flooring.

The school is scheduled to open in fall 2008, but some work will continue while students and staff are in the building, Superintendent William Patterson said.

Students will move into a new high school building this fall.

Construction on the east side of the current high school could start in March, Doty said. The presence

of students will not interfere with work since it is a new portion of the building, he said.

Crews will move dirt and build the foundation for one of the new educational pods, Doty said. Starting the project while students are still in school will not close any portions of the parking lot that are not already blocked off, he said.

The district received 80 bids for 20 parts of the project. Jobs that were out for bid included demolition, electrical work, terrazzo flooring, wall coverings, masonry and construction.

All of the bids accepted came from the lowest bidders, Doty said. All of the companies hired

are in Indiana, but none is from Johnson County.

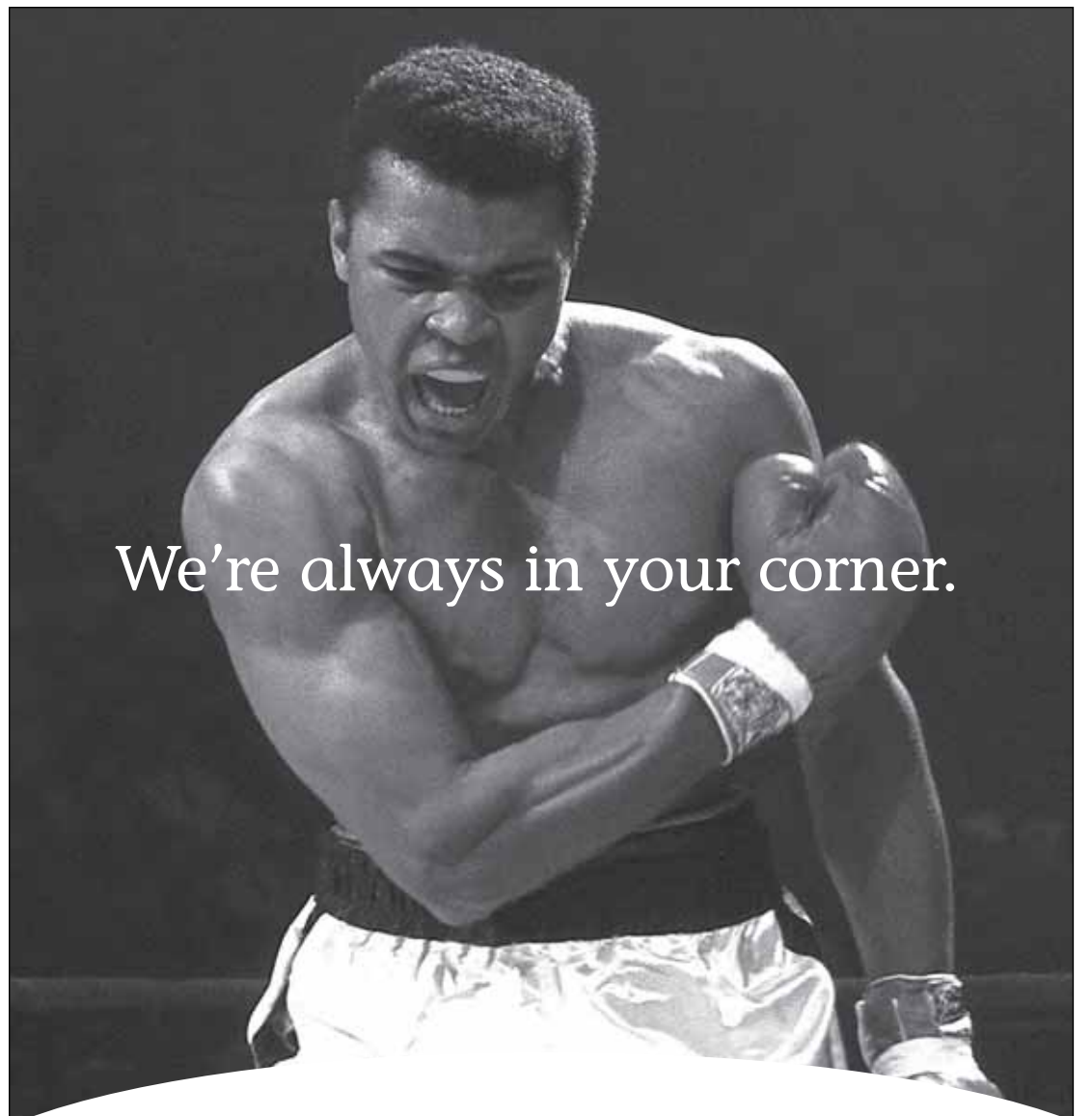
R.E. Griesemer in Indianapolis earned the largest portion of the project at about \$5.37 million. The company will do mechanical, test and balance work, and install a heating, ventilation and air-conditioning control system.

Gaylor Electric in Carmel will do electrical work for about \$5.2 million.

The technical review committee accepted two alternates for the project, which reduced the price by \$68,000, Doty said. For parts of the electrical work, crews will use aluminum wire instead of copper, which saves \$57,000, he said.



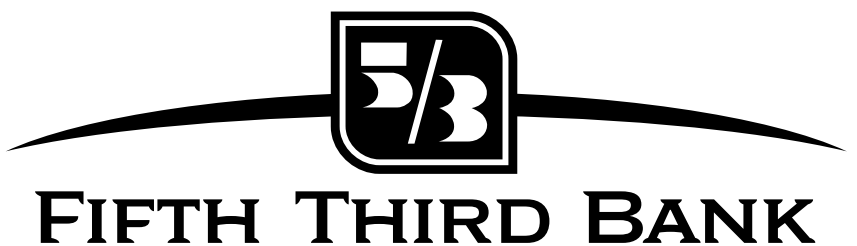

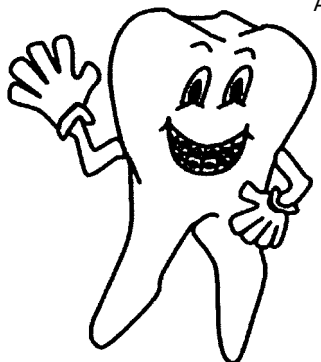
