## Veneer firm to add workers

A revitalized veneer business in Trafalgar will add as many as 100 new jobs in the next year, a human resources manager said.

Hoosier Veneer opened in October in the space where another veneer company had been.

Ohio businessman John Burns, who owns a veneer company in Albany, Ohio, and other private investors bought the building when Besse Veneer closed last year.

The company hopes to start a second shift in the next two or three weeks, human resource manager Patty Burgett said.

Between 70 and 100 employees will be added within the next year to the current 45 employees, she said. Hoosier Veneer is still in the hiring process, she said.

Hoosier Veneer is a custom-cutting veneer mill where customers can bring logs they purchased for processing, she said. Workers heat the wood, cut the logs into thin sheets and dry the wood to remove moisture.

Then the customer can clip the wood according to what it will be used for, she said.

The veneer is then used to make furniture, doors, cabinets or panels, Burgett said.

Hoosier Veneer's investors were not associated with the previous company, Besse Veneer, Burgett said. The company now has all new employees and management and is not connected to the former business, she said.


