conference room, work areas and storage for the athletic director.

The list also includes a 5,300-square-foot physical conditioning lab and 19,000 square feet for study halls, computer labs and a rehearsal stage.

In the coming weeks, architects will find out how those needs would change to accommodate enrollment that could grow to 3,400 students during the next two decades.

At a meeting Jan. 22, architects will give estimates on what size the school would have to be if the enrollment were to climb to 3,431 students, said Dan Rawlins, a project manager with Inter-Design architects.

An aggressive enrollment projection by the Indiana University Kelley School of Business has put the high school at almost 3,500 students by 2025.

Meanwhile, educators are trying to figure out how to best teach students and whether the traditional core high school should be changed. The architects also will develop plans showing how big the high school would need to be if students were

split into small learning communities or a mix of those and a traditional high school, Rawlins said.

Once construction starts, Hunt Construction will be expected to keep track of expansion and renovation projects that could be going on during school hours. The company may be charged with designing temporary entrances and exits to the school.

Workers will have to make sure critical functions such as heat and electricity at the building are not lost while construction is taking place.

The school district also will pay a \$44,000 bonus if the work stays on budget and on schedule, safety rules are followed and school officials are satisfied with the final product.

Hunt Construction was recommended because of the company's staffing levels, cost, experience and communication skills.

Three other companies were interviewed for the job since August. They are Geupel DeMars Hagerman, SCS Construction Services and Verckler Construction Managers, all based in and around Indianapolis, said Paul Gabriel, chief financial officer for the district.

The next lowest price was Geupel DeMars Hagerman at about \$1.5 million, he said.

in cash and checks that hadn't been deposited into the group's account.

Zellman told the court that the money was taken to care for her children because she was going through a divorce.

Loyd, however, said Zellman's motives were selfish, not maternal, since her husband was willing to care for the children at the time.

Zellman was taken to the Johnson County jail immediately after she was sentenced. She previously had been free on bond.

Johnson County Prosecutor Lance Hamner said she will be taken to a state prison to serve her sentence.

"I think (the sentence) sends a message to anyone who thinks stealing money that has been entrusted to you is a way to solve your financial problems," he said.

"Hearing big steel doors close behind you can be a powerful deterrent. I hope this defendant has learned her lesson."
